INTRODUCTION TO THE REPORT:

The Nigeria REDD+ Readiness Programme (supported by the UN REDD Programme and the FCPF with the World Bank as an Implementing Partner) is the main vehicle for REDD+ readiness in the country, with an initial priority focus in Cross River State (further expanded to Ondo and Nasarawa States). The goal of the Programme is to enable Nigeria to contribute to climate change mitigation through improved forest conservation and enhancing sustainable community livelihoods. The Programme will thus support Nigeria to contribute to climate-change mitigation in the forest sector, with initial work in Cross River State, which has a track record in community forest management and an engagement in forest conservation, aside from having a relatively high forest cover. The objective of the UN REDD National Programme is to build the REDD+ mechanism in Nigeria, using Cross River State as a demonstration model. The UN REDD National Programme has therefore constructed the REDD+ system from the grassroots through intense action in Cross River State (CRS). REDD+ readiness in CRS informed the national REDD+ readiness framework and is being replicated in two other states of Nasarawa and Ondo, under the FCPF support. The objective of the FPCF support to REDD+ Readiness is to support Nigeria design a socially and environmentally sound strategy



5. Main Lessons Learned

This section should be used to provide information on important lessons learnt since the beginning of the readiness process. As this is a semi-annual report, it is expected that this section will be fairly substantial, making reference to different lessons learning documents, and/or events developed and dealing with issues of particular interest with respect to readiness of carbon funding under REDD+.

Major lessons learnt were in the area minimzing impact of political changes on project implementation progress. This became evident in Cross River State when a new administration came into place. High level missions for consultation and advocacy had to be carried out in order to minimize negative impacts on project implementation.

- Continuous Stakeholders/institutional capacity building & strengthening has been found to be very critical to successful Programme implementation;
- A well-defined institutional arrangement in which roles and responsibilities of stakeholders are clearly spelt out is germane to institutionalisation of Programme;
- Strong political will to ensure sustainability of gains; Community resentment, insecurity & political issues can constitute drawback;
- Implementation has strengthened opportunities for external support for REDD+ (CC) activities in CRS;
- Continuous sensitisation of communities about REDD+ within and outside Programme pilot sites inevitable to disabuse minds;
- High community enthusiasm in the MRV process; Community-driven strategy (community-based forest monitoring) best option for Programme sustainability;
- Process can be adventurous;
