About this document

Report preparation

1. In brief, what were the main REDD+ readiness-related <u>activities</u> and achievements delivered within your country during the last year?

- Activities For example, strategy / policy drafting, stakeholder consultation events, capacity building / training, awareness raising initiatives
- Achievements For example, x number of individuals attended REDD+ consultations (sex disaggregated, if available), national REDD+ strategy was finalised, government formally adopted national REDD+ related policy/s, NFMS was established, partnership agreement with private sector association signed

Activities

- National REDD+ Task Force meeting held in September 2019 and provided guidance on finalization of the NRS. Apart from NRTF members representatives of six Technical Working Groups (TWG), DoF senior staff, representatives from the ER Program provinces and development partners participated in this meeting
- Numerous TWG meetings held on priority areas of safeguards, benefit sharing plan, MRV, and legal issues given the focus was on completing all requirements leading up to ERPA signature
- Consultations with the TWG held on developing the Safeguards Information System (SIS) and field research undertaken
- Meetings with Provincial REDD+ Task Force (PRTF) to endorse Provincial REDD+ Action Plans (PRAPs), provide an update on progress and approval of future plans
- Field research and consultations in ER provinces, and other provinces to develop SIS
- At the national level, public awareness raising on REDD+, sustainable forest management and biodiversity conservation at the annual That Luang Festival in November 2019 in Vientiane. The REDD+ stall displayed posters and exhibits related to REDD+ in Lao PDR
- At the provincial level, Provincial REDD+ Office in collaboration with PAFO carried out public awareness raising through diverse events, including local festivals, and the national plantation day
- Capacity building at provincial and district levels on Training of Trainers, GIS training; forest survey and mapping; patrolling; information technology; and financial and procurement procedures

- Annual cross province exchange workshops on lessons from implementation of FCPF project activities and REDD+
- Multiple consultations, meetings discussions, and hosting of World Bank physical and virtual missions to prepare ERPA package for signature.

Achievements

- ERPA Preparation: The focus has remained on completing all the requirements for the ERPA and all milestones have been completed
- Term Sheet: The Term Sheet was negotiated and agreed with the Carbon Fund
- ERPA Drafts: Two draft ERPA received and are under review with formal negotiations scheduled to be completed within Quarter 3 2020
- Safeguards: The package of safeguards documents were completed and received clearance and disclosed on the DoF website. These include SESA, ESMF, EGPF, RPF and PF
- Advanced Benefit Sharing Plan: The work on the BSP through the year resulted in its acceptance as Advanced. The Advanced Draft BSP was disclosed on the DoF website
- ERPA Legal Documentation: All legal documentation related to the Program Entity ability to transfer ERs; sub-agreement; and reversal management completed and submitted to the CF
- National Forest Management System: Multiple consultations and discussions have clarified improvements to the NFMS that will also meet the requirements of ERPA monitoring and verification
- Monitoring, Measurement and Reporting: A consortium of Development Partners has been established that will provide technical support to MMR and develop feasible response through improved methods. A work plan has been developed and adequate funds secured
- National REDD+ Strategy: The NRS review has been undertaken and it is now aligned with the Forest Law 2019. The NRS is expected to receive approval in Quarter 3 2020 along with the on going revision of the Forest Strategy 2030 that is currently being drafted
- Safeguards Information System: A first draft of the SIS has been prepared including a work plan
- Safeguards Due Diligence for potential retroactive ER: Significant preparatory work undertaken for the Due Diligence process that will be finalized by Quarter 4 2020
- Capacity Building: Over 1,000 participants received training through different events. In addition a capacity building needs and gap assessment has been undertaken for REDD+ implementation. A capacity building plan with themes and modules has been developed to strengthen national and sub-national institutions for project implementation
- The land use, land use change assessment for 2019 has been completed and is in the process of receiving MAF approval
- The GoL received financial support from the Green Climate Fund and other partners for implementation of the ERP and will be executed by the GIZ. A launch workshop was held in June 2020
- Significant progress made in discussions with the GCF with an agreement that Lao PDR would submit a concept note and associated documents to request results-based payments for the period 2015 to 2018. The concept note is expected to be ready in Quarter 4 2020
- National and provincial public awareness events on REDD+ with outreach to approximately 4,000 persons and 7,500 communication products distributed

2. What were the main REDD+ readiness-related challenges and/or problems during the last year?

- For example, lack of engagement from key stakeholders, political barriers, limited funding
- While the availability of professionals with experience of REDD+ requirements and familiarity with Lao PDR has improved this still remains a challenge
- Availability of senior government staff, representatives of development partners and TWGs has improved but can still lead to delays
- Developing a response to NFMS and MMR remained a challenge during the early part of the year but with substantial efforts continues to be resolved with support from development partners
- COVID -19 restrictions emerged as a significant challenge but this was mitigated through use of virtual meetings, virtual appraisal, and protocols for improved communication

- Several meetings, field visits, and events however had to be cancelled and postponed due to COVID-19 including data collection for SIS development and REDD+ awareness

The NRS provides a suite of intervention options to promote, sustain, and enhance livelihoods and these are further re-enforced in the ERPD and are mentioned in many programmes and sub programmes and interventions namely:

- -Demonstrate good practices, and develop diverse livelihood models based on local potentials and provide financing and opportunities for agriculture production:
- -Demonstrate good practices and develop various livelihood models based on local potentials, promote and develop local livelihood alternatives through income-generating activities including ecotourism;
- -Promote participation of private sector and individuals in applying the commercial and smallholder tree plantation models by households and community in order to compensate or reduce the use of wood from natural forests and to generate income for local people.
