1. GENERAL INTRODUCTION

Introduction to the report, its main purpose and sections. Short description of FCPF support in country.

Mozambique is one of the 37 countries eligible to benefit from the Forest Carbon Partnership Facility (FCPF) to access funding to develop and implement strategies aiming to reduce emissions from deforestation and forest degradation (REDD). In December 2008 the Government of Mozambique, namely Ministry of the Coordination of Environmental Affairs (MICOA) and Directorate National of Land and Forestry (DNTF), Ministry of Agriculture (MINAG) jointly initiated the process of preparing a reduced emissions from deforestation and forest degradation (REDD) project idea note (R-PIN) with a funding from the Norwegian Embassy in Maputo and technical support from INDUFOR, and submitted the Note to the FCPF in March 2009 which was subsequently approved in May 2009. The R-PP was endorsed by the FCPF Participants Committee in March, 2012. The country submitted a revised version addressing the FCPF PC comments in January 2013, which was posted on the FCPF website. The WB conducted its due diligence in view of signing a Grant Agreement for R-PP implementation. The Preparation Grant Agreement (US\$3.6 million) was signed on 12th July 2013. All effectiveness conditions have been met and disbursement of funds had started in February 2014.

Annual progress reports for Readiness are provided for the FCPF following a reporting format developed by the FCPF team.

Progress:

A REDD+ technical unit (UT-REDD+) is a meeting forum under DNGA, MICOA and DNTF, MINAG that coordinate and guide the day to day implementation during the readiness phase. The UT-REDD+ is coordinating various activities for readiness preparation of REDD+ under technical council of national council for sustainable development (CONDES) which is chaired by the vice minister of MICOA. The UT-REDD+ is comprise of about eight assigned officers of MICOA and MINAG and be supported by contracted technical assistance (five experts). At moment, four out of five technical assistance experts have been contracted as follows

- Hired Technical assistant of REDD+ program
- Hired procurement officer
- Hired Assistant for Pilot Projects
- Hired finance assistant
- Mozambique is one of the first countries in the world that elaborated a Decree of REDD+, therefore, there is need to disclosures at communities level. At moment, UT-REDD+ with help of others institutions have begun to disclosure at provincial governor level.
- In order to elaborate National strategy of REDD+ the UT-REDD+ Hired a consultant for the definition of forests. As we know that, there are many definition of forest but still not have definition of forest for REDD+

Key Achievements with focus on higher level results:

The most important activity was hiring the staff. Those technical will bring more speed to the project and that will help us to fulfil our goals. On top of that the disclosure of REDD+ decree at provincial Govern level (Governor and all provincial directors) makes more important in terms of communication from the top to down also it helps clearly understand of REDD+ program. Until now the UT-REDD+ has done 7 provinces out of 11. During the disclosure of Decree 73/2013, it was noted that there is a need to start explain the basic of REDD+ at all level (provincial govern and community levels), therefore, it's urgent to do communication material. However, there are two provinces that were not necessary to explain them the basic of REDD+ because there is a company implementing REDD+ project.

The Decree of REDD+ contains: 5 chapters

Important issues /problems that arose during the reporting period:

During the reporting period, the important problem that arose was:

• Delay procurement. The problem arose from the slow start of procurement of staff and goods. This problem happens due to over load of current procurement of FUNAB. Thus it was necessary to hire procurement officer that will focus only on this project (REDD+) From 11 of august the new procurement officer will be working and he will take those activities that are belated.

At moment there is technical unit of REDD+ that is responsible for implementation of activities related to REDD +. The Technical Unit of REDD + is coordinated by the National Directorate of the Ministry responsible for Environmental Management for the Coordination of Environmental Action and the National Directorate responsible for the Management of Land and Forests Ministry of Agriculture. Although these two groups have power to make decision, they must listen the REDD technical Review Committee (TRC). The TRC provides an advisory role to the UT-REDD+. It is composed of several members of various institutions that range from Government, NGOs, religion institutions, business sector, civil society and communities association. At moment 8 members out of 12 have been pointed however, UT-REDD+ has not yet scheduled any meeting. The UT –REDD+ must each quarterly provide report to the technical review committee (CTR). UT-REDD is planning to have the first meeting on October after national elections. Happening this meeting we can consider Level of multi-stakeholder participation and engagement in decision making processes significant.

Please describe these policy reforms:		

The Government of Mozambique through Decree 70/2013, of 20 December, adopted a Regulation establishing the procedures for projects and Reducing Emissions from Deforestation and Forest Degradation - REDD +, which creates in its Article 2 the Technical Unit of REDD +, which is subordinate to the ministers overseeing the areas of Environment and Agriculture.

Article 7 of the Regulation sets out the need to define the composition and functioning of the Technical Unit of REDD + that is responsible for the implementation of activities related to REDD +. In order to operationalize requirements established in paragraph 3 of Article 7 of Decree 70/2013, of 20 December, it was elaborated a diploma ministerial that will be aproved by both ministers (Minster of Agriculture and Environment)

National REDD+ Readiness Management arrangement

One key important in this component is hire of Technical of procurement, technical of finance, Technical assistant of REDD+ program and Assistant for Pilot Projects. Although, there is need to hire more staff, these will boost the technical unite of REDD+ in order to comply with annual plan and R-PP. As mentioned at top, the procurement of good, staff and services are delay because of overload of FUNAB's procurement. However almost 80% of recruitments are done

The establishment of the national REDD+ management (technical review committee and Technical Unit of REDD+) has been 70% completed by now, is quite an important step for the effective implementation of the REDD+ Readiness although is missing the first meeting and REDD+ awareness and training to all members of the REDD+ management bodies. However, there is an ongoing a plan to set up meeting urgently since technical review committee is the organ of consultation and oversight of REDD+ activities. 70% done

Promotion of multi-stakeholder consultations

During the report period, the technical unit has beginning to involve stakeholder especially regarding dissemination of REDD+ in Mozambique. There is need to comunicate with stakeholder, civil society, communities and business sector the stage of REDD+ in Mozambique in order to not be an isolated process. But also give opportunity for the stakeholders analyse strength, opportunities, weakness and challenges of REDD+ in Mozambique. It is an ongoing negotiation with a network of NGO's to coordinate the dissemination of REDD+ process at community level since NGO's have work at community level. 30% done

REDD Strategy Preparation:

Consultancy firm has been contracted to work on definition of forest for REDD+. The consultancy will take 140 days and all activities regarding to Stakeholder Consultations and Communication will be monitoring by technical unit of REDD+. This monitor is to make sure that stakeholder consultation has been done as recommended in R-PP. 50% done

Short listing of Consultancy firms has been completed and request for proposals has been submitted to the Bank for review for consultancy service on SESA. Mention that before approved of Term of Reference of SESA, it has been prepared as part of the R-PP and consultation seminar on SESA TOR was held on 31 st March 2014; The World Bank has made available the technical unit of -REDD + an expert in SESA staff if necessary. With this help, the technical unit of REDD+ is planning to contract the firm in two months. 35% done.

In terms of MRV Representative Officials from Mozambique participated in SADC meeting on MRV in Johannesburg, South Africa in May 2012 and discussed the possibilities of MRV development considering forest types representing the region.

One of the officers of DNTF was sent to the JICA training on REDD+ MRV from May for 2 months in Japan. On 24th September 2013. a National


