
Peru RPP: TAP 3rd review

Peru: high forested (in the Amazon) - low deforestation

REDD+ embedded in a national conservation strategy. Surface under forest cover 68 million ha of forests (about 60 million ha closed forests in Amazon)



Peru: an evolving R-PP based on high country ownership and intensive consultation

Overall Summary: Strengths of the RPP

- Overall, the progress made since the first draft (April 2010) and the initial PC-8 draft to the final PC-8 is enormous and the TAP's technical assessment is positive.
- The R-PP is a well elaborated document that is, from a technical viewpoint, sufficient to start an R-PP implementation process
- The TAP noted the responsiveness of Peru in integrating civil society and indigenous peoples contributions when elaborating the current version of the R-PP
- The process of developing the R-PP has helped stimulate a difficult but productive dialogue between all interested parties.
- → The current R-PP constitutes a good basis for Readiness implementation from a technical standpoint.

Challenges in the R-PP

- The document is a strong document. However the rapid pace of the policy dialog within the country and in the Mesa REDD has been the primary challenge in the preparation of the R-PP
- Looking forward to the R-PP implementation:
 - ■The various political and social issues raised in the development of the R-PP reveal long lasting issues among the government and stakeholders that will require a dedicated and continuous attention in the implementation of the R-PP
 - ■The decision to focus primarily on two pilot provinces will require further analysis and policy development during the implementation of the R-PP

Final Recommendations

- Continuing to actively address in the early stage of the R-PP implementation the insight and processes provided by the Mesa REDD+. These include:
 - the harmonization of the drivers of DD, the REDD+ strategy and MRV design, in particular how they evolve from the pilot provinces into an eventual national programme
 - articulating a specific set of activities that make progress on the challenging land tenure and rights issues raised by indigenous peoples organizations
- As the R-PP begins to be implemented, Peru will need to prepare clearly defined yearly work plans with defined responsibilities for each output; and develop monitoring arrangements for the expected outcomes.
