About this document

- a) On January 28th 2021, Fiji signed the Emission Reduction Payment Agreement (ERPA). The agreement was signed by the Attorney General and Minister for Economy, Honourable Aiyaz Syed-Khaiyum on behalf of the Fiji Government. The status of the 2 conditions of effectiveness are as follows: -
 - The final draft of the Benefit Sharing was submitted to the FCPF-Carbon Fund at the end of June for a 2-week no objection.
- b) The finalization of the Climate Change Act, which is being led by the Climate Change Division of the Ministry of Economy in conjunction with the Ministry of Forestry (MoF), will be tabled in the August session of Parliament. The Act is expected to be enacted before the end of the calendar year.
- c) The first draft of the REDD+ Strategy was presented at the December 11th 2020 REDD+ Steering Committee (RSC) Meeting. A technical working group made of RSC members have been meeting (virtually) to finalize the report and expected to be completed by end of July 2021.

- d) The first draft of report on the review of the REDD+ Policy (20110) was first presented (virtually) to the Ministry of Forestry (MoF) on Tuesday 8th June 2021. The final report (revised REDD+ Policy) is expected by August 2021.
- e) The Safeguard Information System (SIS) has been developed and the final report is expected by end of July 2021.
- f) The work on detecting Forest Degradation through Remote-sensing (GIS) approaches (methodology) has been completed.
- g) The development of the National Forest Inventory for 2006 (NFI, 2006) will be completed by the end of July. The analysis of the 2006 field data and report, as one part, has been completed. The final report will include the analysis of the Permanent Sample Plots (PSP, 2006).
- h) The work on designing and execution of the NFI 2020 was suspended in April, due to COVID-19 restrictions. Todate, 13% of the field data assessment (measurements) and collection of field samples have been achieved.
- i) The NFMS integration framework development was completed in April 2021. Further enhancement and population work and training of users is being conducted and expected to be completed by the end of August 2021.
- j) The rolling out of the awareness campaign to promote the national Emission Reduction has been suspended due to COVID-19 restrictions. The messaging material have been developed.
- k) Work on the assessment of safeguards on retroactive carbon emission level has been suspended due to COVID-19 restrictions. The first draft has been developed.
- Work on the development of 20 district-level integrated land use plans will be completed by the end of Dec 2021.
 To-date, 10 plans have been developed and will undergo internal vetting and socializing process by the end of July.
- m) The Allometric calculation work has been suspended due to COVID-19 restrictions.

2. What were the main REDD+ readiness-related challenges and/or problems during the last year?

• For example, lack of engagement from key stakeholders, political barriers, limited funding

The bureaucracy of the domestic system for approving and releasing of grant fund, inter-ministerial and internally within the Ministry of Forestry, including the vetting of contractual agreements and approval of procurement, remains a challenge. There have been numerous inter-ministerial meetings and discussions held in an effort to reduce turnaround time for the vetting process.

In the last 6-months (Jan – June 2021), the project was significantly delayed. The country encountered two tropical cyclones that made landfall in late December 2020 and followed by the second in early January 2021. The situation was exacerbated by the recording of the second wave of the COVID-19 pandemic in mid-March, which has not abated and for the better part of the 6-month period, the Fiji Government re-diverted it attention and resources towards the rehabilitation work and national containment efforts. The national COVID-19 restrictions, included social distancing and restricted gathering and the daily enforcement curfews, led to the closure of businesses and domestic service providers and suppliers. Similar difficulties were also encountered for offshore supplies and dependent on the country's pandemic situation. Free-movement was not encouraged and restricted due to the imposition of containment zones and all non-essential service workers were required to work-from-home (WFH). The use of the virtual platform became the norm for discussions, meetings and progressing work but this only really started in early June and also depended on parties' availability, having access and connectivity to the virtual platforms.

The project has established a REDD+ Pilot Site on Viti Levu. The Government provides and annual Capital Grant that supports the community in the following livelihood activities: -

- a) Annual land rental (one-off compensation payment currently being discussed)
- b) Establishment of tree nurseries;
- c) Construction of Bore Hole and water articulation system
- d) Solar system

Under the ER Program of activities, 3,780 Ha is targeted to establish Climate Smart Agricultural approaches that include: -

- a) Agroforestry (use of shade tolerant crops as cash crops)
- b) Riparian restoration;
- c) Alternative livelihood ventures (honey and vanilla production)
