COMPONENT 1A. NATIONAL REDD+ MANAGEMENT ARRANGEMENTS

 Designated and functional State Level REDD+ Secretariats in the additional four states of Plateau, Edo, Ogun and Kaduna States were commissioned and are functioning. The State REDD+ ensures the coordination of the various REDD+ pilot site activities in the state and interfacing with relevant ministries, departments and agencies (MDAs) at the State levels. The State REDD+ Secretariat also oversees the activities of the local governments, NGOs, civil society, academia, the private sector, local communities and traditional authorities working in the field of environment, forestry and natural resource management.

- Formation of platform of Media and Civil society organization platforms for the Nigeria REDD+ programme was achieved.
- High Level Retreat with Parliamentarian held, with a communique highlighting areas of support and partnership in the development of REDD+ programme
- Safety and security Management Plan for REDD+ Readiness and Investment Process developed and currently been reviewed by the Bank.
- The preparation of Nigeria REDD+ R-PACKAGE completed, and to be presented at the forthcoming PA15/PC31 for review and approval. Though Nigeria is Not in the Carbon Fund, but because of it stride in its readiness process, had to develop it R-Package for PC assessment for possible future REDD+ investment opportunities.
- REDD+ IEC material for Publicity of REDD+ Programme Produced.
- Capacity-Enhancement and Training for National and State REDD+ Secretariat Officers undertaken.
- External Audit exercise for 2021 Conducted and report sent to the Bank

COMPONENT 1B. CONSULTATION, PARTICIPATION AND OUTREACH

- Consultancy for the design of Nigeria's REDD+ Finance Framework including Forest Carbon Offsets /Credit Programme completed.
- Engagement meetings/ workshops with legislators National and States.
- the aim of the retreat was to develope options to enhance REDD+ contributions to National and Sub-National ddevelopment; and strengthening legislative support for effective REDD+ governance and sustainable financing.
- The participants included:
- National Assembly members (6-Senators, 8-house of Representatives)
- A total of 21 State Legislators 3 each from seven REDD+ state and Honourable Commissioners of Environment & Agriculture were part of the Parliamentarian retreat held in May, 2022.
- Engagements with forest dependent communities of the 17 livelihood pilot sites in the 7 REDD+ States
- knowledge sharing within REDD+ Communities in 3 REDD+ States were organised , using the early readiness States of Cross River, Ondo and Nasarawa States.
- There were general outreach during the National Forest Carbon Inventory with forest dependent communities as well gathering of socio-economic data. Total number of people reached were 991. (Men 420 and Women 571). Some of the communities engaged were: Namu, Pankshin, Lantang, Bassa, Barkin Ladi, Mangu, Lange, Polwaya, Gwantu, kaura, Robo, Makarfi, Kudan, Kufana, Kagarko, Kagoma, Lere, kauru, Soba,

 National REDD+ Strategy developed, validated and launched both Nationally and Internationally at COP26 in Glasgow.

- Additional data of Forest Carbon Inventory in 6 States (Edo, Ogun, Plateau Kaduna, Ondo nad Nasarawa States) undertaken. The Inventory team was made-up of Forest dependent community members, Academia, Civil Society organizations, NGOs, REDD+ secretariat MRV team and Relevant MDAs. Data to be use for country's modified FREL, planned to be submitted to UNFCCC on or Before January, 2023.
- Reviewed and Finalization of the Resettlement Policy Frame (RPF) and Process Framework (PF) submitted to the Bank.

- The development and operationalization of the National Forest Monitoring System (NFMS) Completed.
- Standard Operation Procedures (SOP) for NFMS developed.

- Procurement of GIS equipment for the seven REDD+ states completed this is to reinforce the existing capacity at the subnational level and also assist in jurisdictional forest carbon estimation and generating periodic forest cover change maps for evidence to GHG emission reduction efforts.

- 2. What were the main REDD+ readiness-related challenges and/or problems during the last year?
 - For example, lack of engagement from key stakeholders, political barriers, limited funding
 - Insecurity within the country inhibits conducting forest carbon inventory especially in plots consider to harbour forest type with High Carbon Value.
 - Some bureaucratic delays at CBN resulted in the missing of achievements of some timelines as well payment apprehension from consultants that were hired by the REDD+ secretariat for some key activities
 - The lack of clarity and assured REDD+ investment projects as the Readiness activity closes, which is generating uncertainty of the promised livelihood enhancements opportunities for forest dependent communities that have partnered with the REDD+ programme in keeping their forest.
