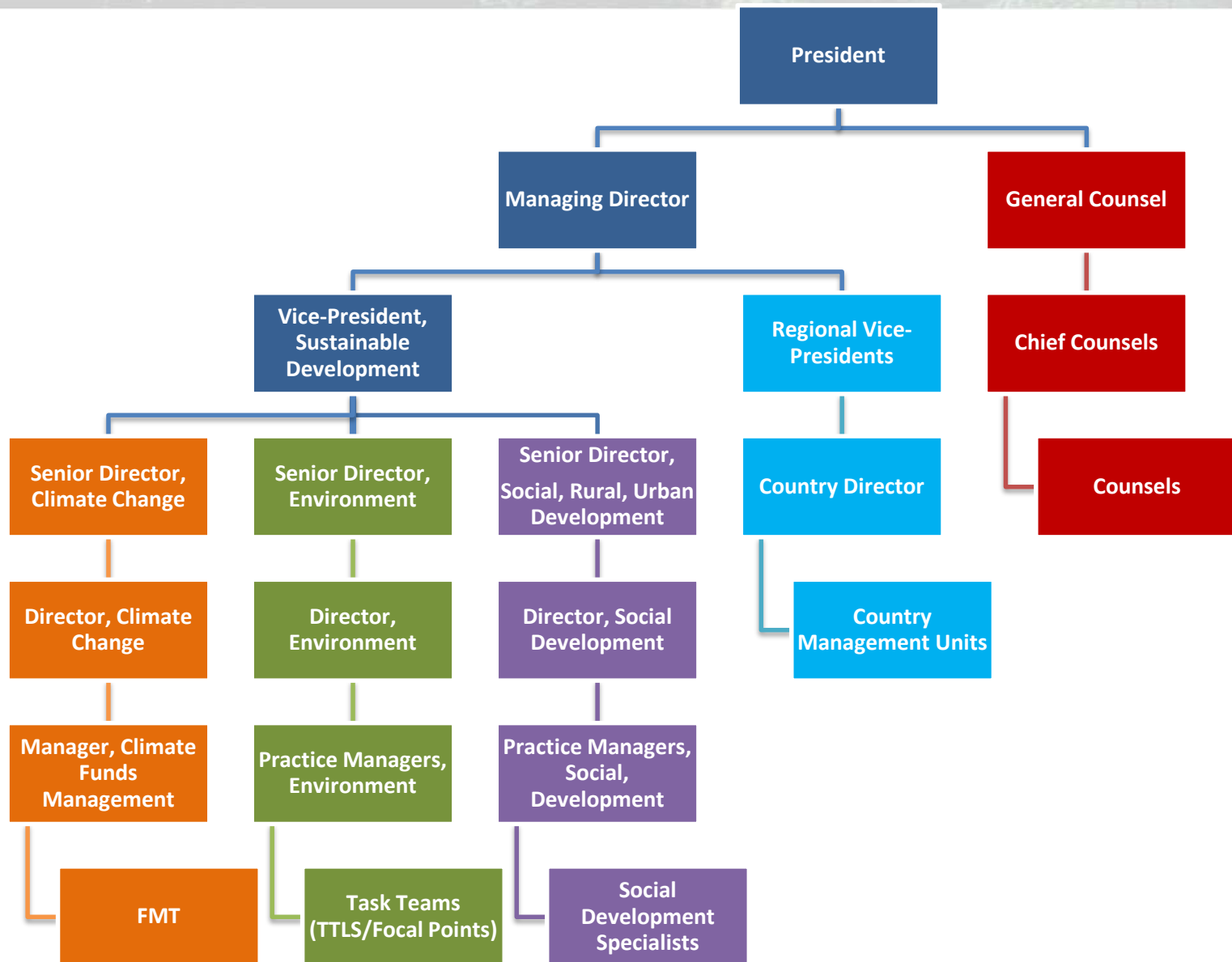

Roles and Responsibilities (1)

- **Climate Change Group – Facility Management Team (FMT)**
 - Act as Trustee of the FCPF's Readiness and Carbon Funds
 - Manage day to-day operation of the FCPF, including secretariat services, fund management and fund administration
 - Conduct ERPA pre-negotiations and negotiations on behalf of CFPs (in conjunction with Legal team)
 - eg. Simon Whitehouse, Fund Manager
 - Marc Sadler, Practice Manager
 - John Roome, Senior Director

Roles and Responsibilities (1)

- **Legal Vice-Presidency – Legal Counsels**
 - Provide legal advice to the FMT on the FCPF facility, and on ERPA pre-negotiations and negotiations
 - eg. Markus Pohlmann and Sachiko Morita, Legal Counsels

Roles and Responsibilities (2)

- **Environment & Natural Resources Global Practice (GP) - Task Teams - Task Team Leaders (TTLs)/Focal Points**
 - Support country in development and implementation of Readiness and ER programs
 - eg. Alex Lotsch, Raj Koirala, Tracy Johns, Focal Points
 - Benoit Bosquet, Practice Manager
 - Senior Director, Karin Kemper

Roles and Responsibilities (2)

- **Social, Urban, Rural, and Resilience Global Practice (GPSURR) - Social Specialists**
 - Advise on social and environmental aspects of programs, including safeguards
 - IP and CSO Capacity Building Programs
 - eg. Nicholas Soikan, Haddy Sey, Kenn Rapp, Social Development Specialists

Roles and Responsibilities (3)

- **Regional Vice-Presidency - Country Management Units (CMUs)**
 - Represent World Bank in relevant REDD+ Country
 - Manage World Bank relationship with country, through Minister of Finance
 - Provide final approval on respective country Readiness and ER programs (signs the ERPA)
 - egs. Country Directors (CDs), Program Leaders (PLs), Country Managers (CMs)
