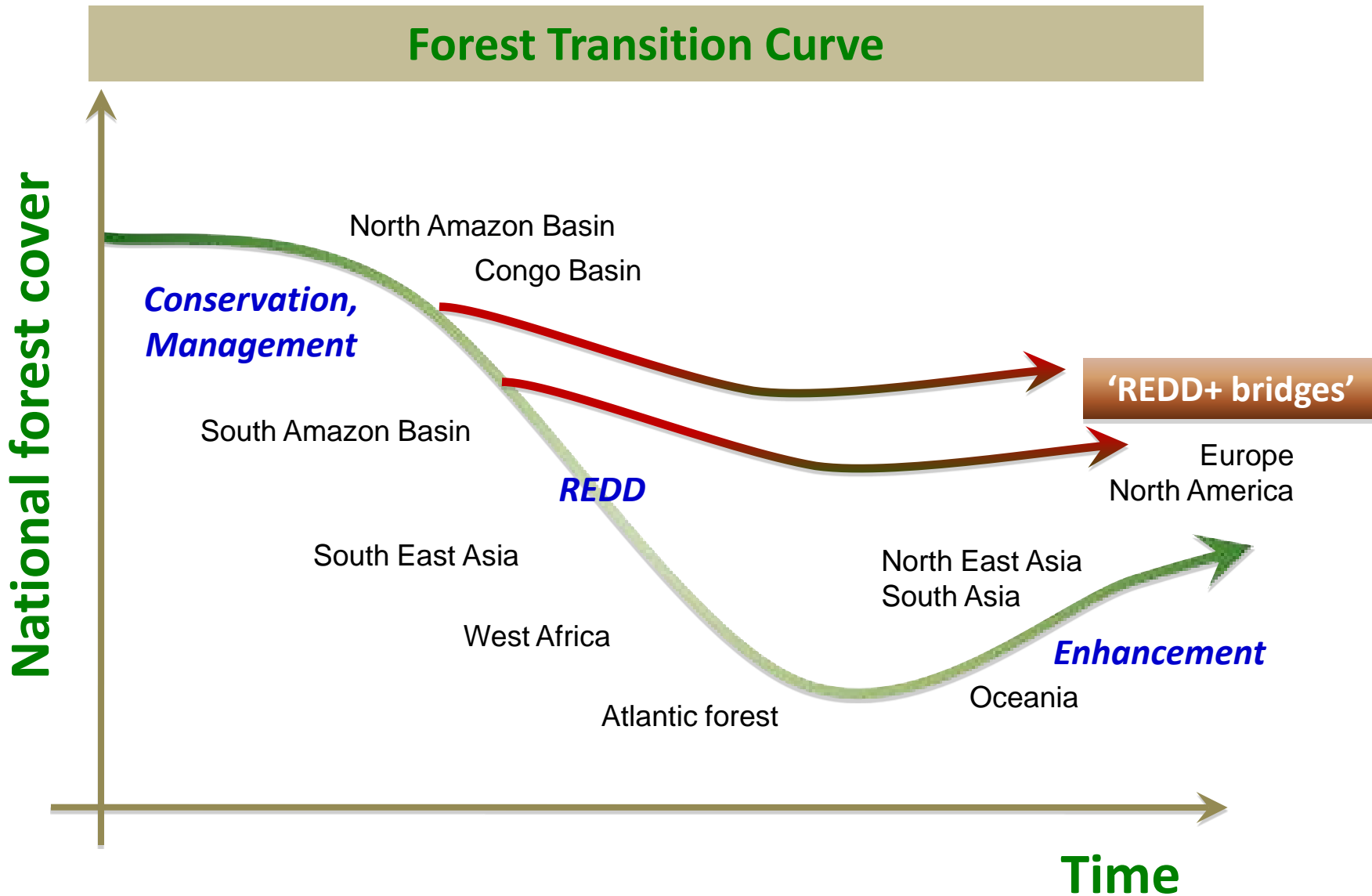


What is REDD+?

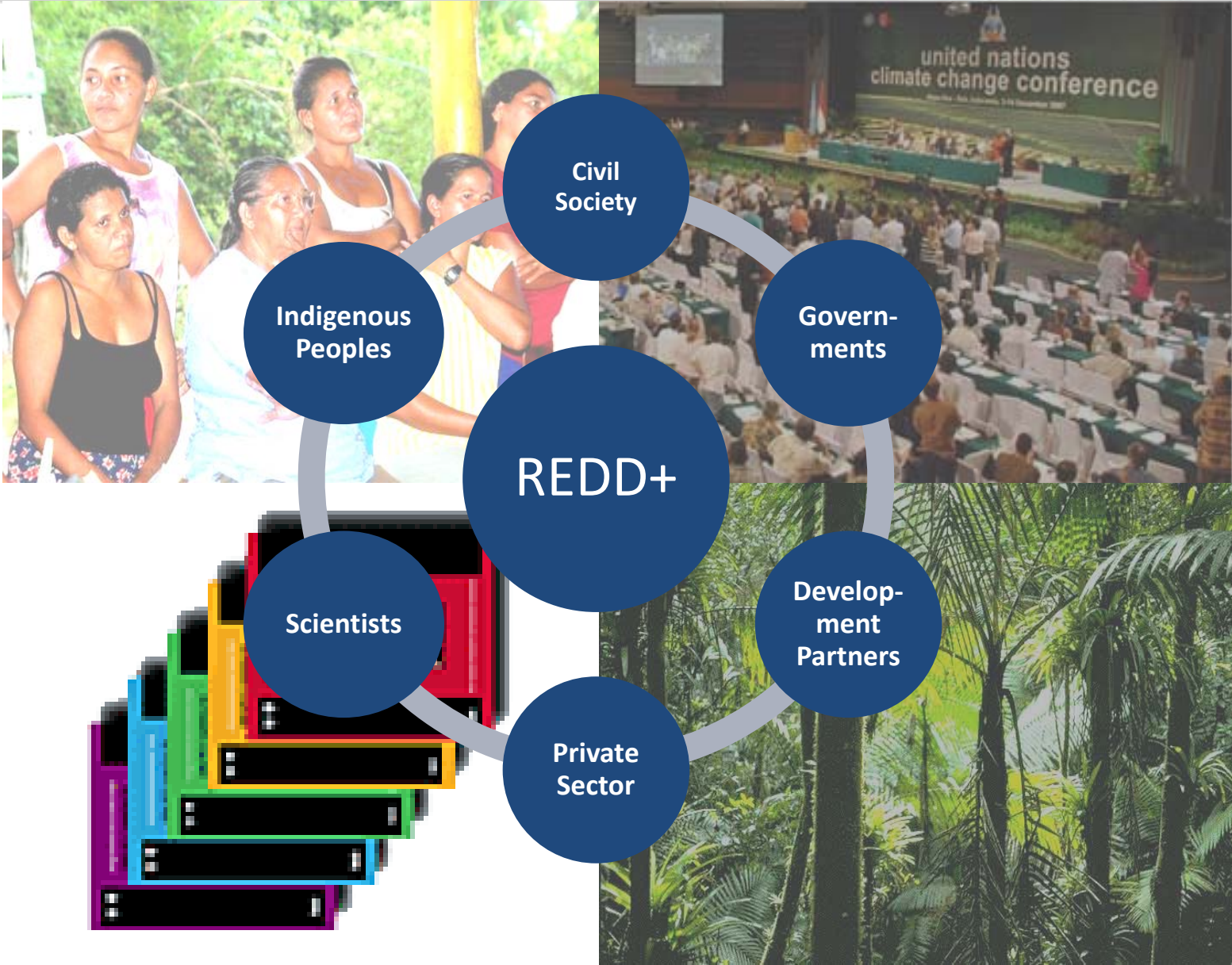


- UNFCCC: “Policy approaches and positive incentives on issues relating to reducing emissions from deforestation and forest degradation in developing countries; and the role of conservation, sustainable management of forests and enhancement of forest carbon stocks in developing countries”
- For the first time, the importance of stemming the loss of tropical forests for mitigating global climate change with financial support from the industrialized world is enshrined in an international agreement
- Safeguards, incl. on Indigenous Peoples

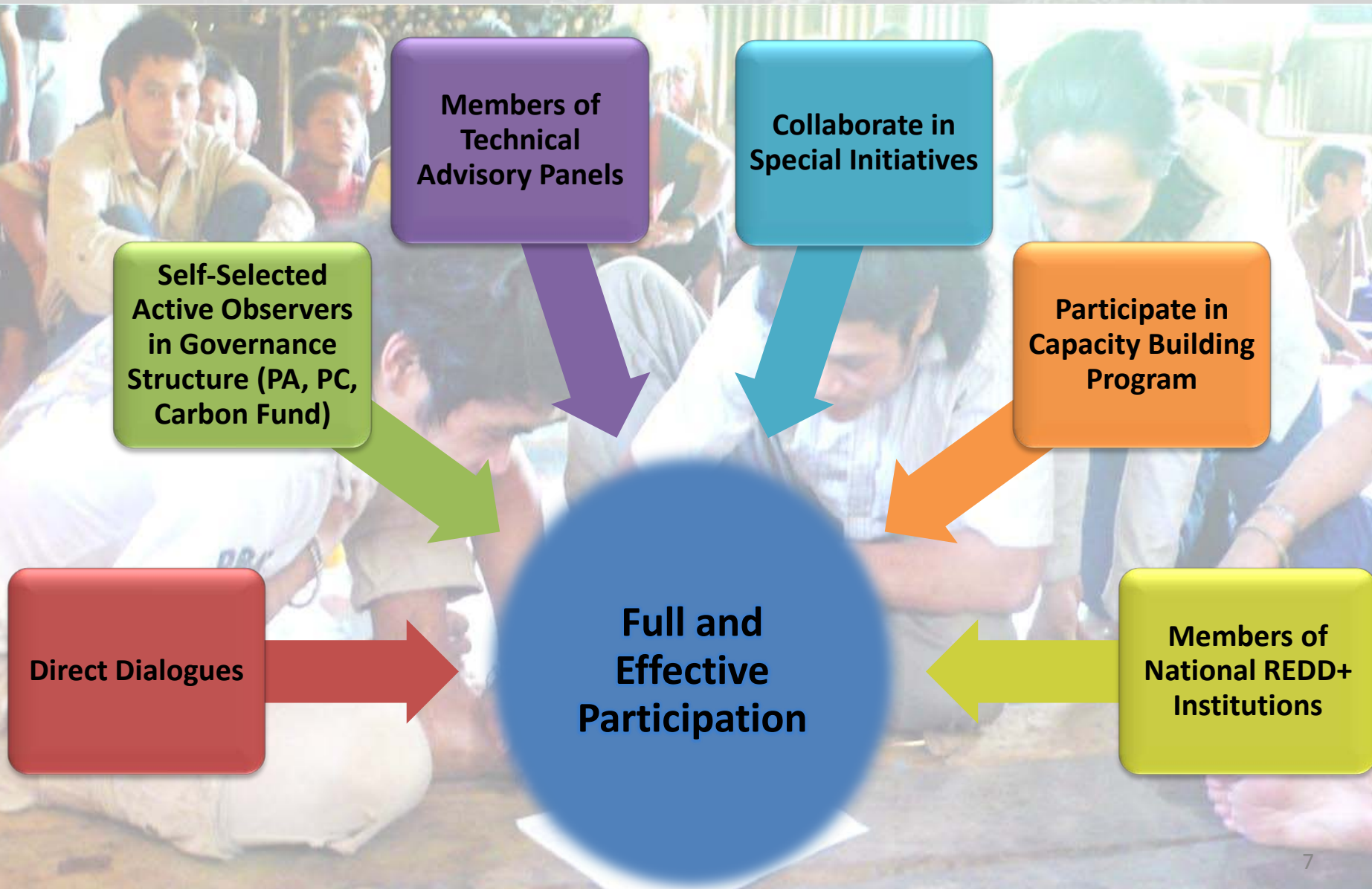

Indigenous Peoples' Capacity Building Program

- \$200,000 per year
- Examples
 - Global level: International Indigenous Peoples' technical workshop with governments before COP16 (xCaret, Mexico)
 - Regional level:
 - COICA (Amazonia) organized regional workshops and produced a reference document on REDD+ before COP15
 - IPACC (Africa) organized workshops and produced toolkit on REDD+ to be used for training of trainers at country level
 - National level:
 - Argentina: ONPIA
 - DRC: Groupe de travail climat REDD de la Société civile
 - Indonesia: Telapak
 - Panama: IIDKY/COONAPIP

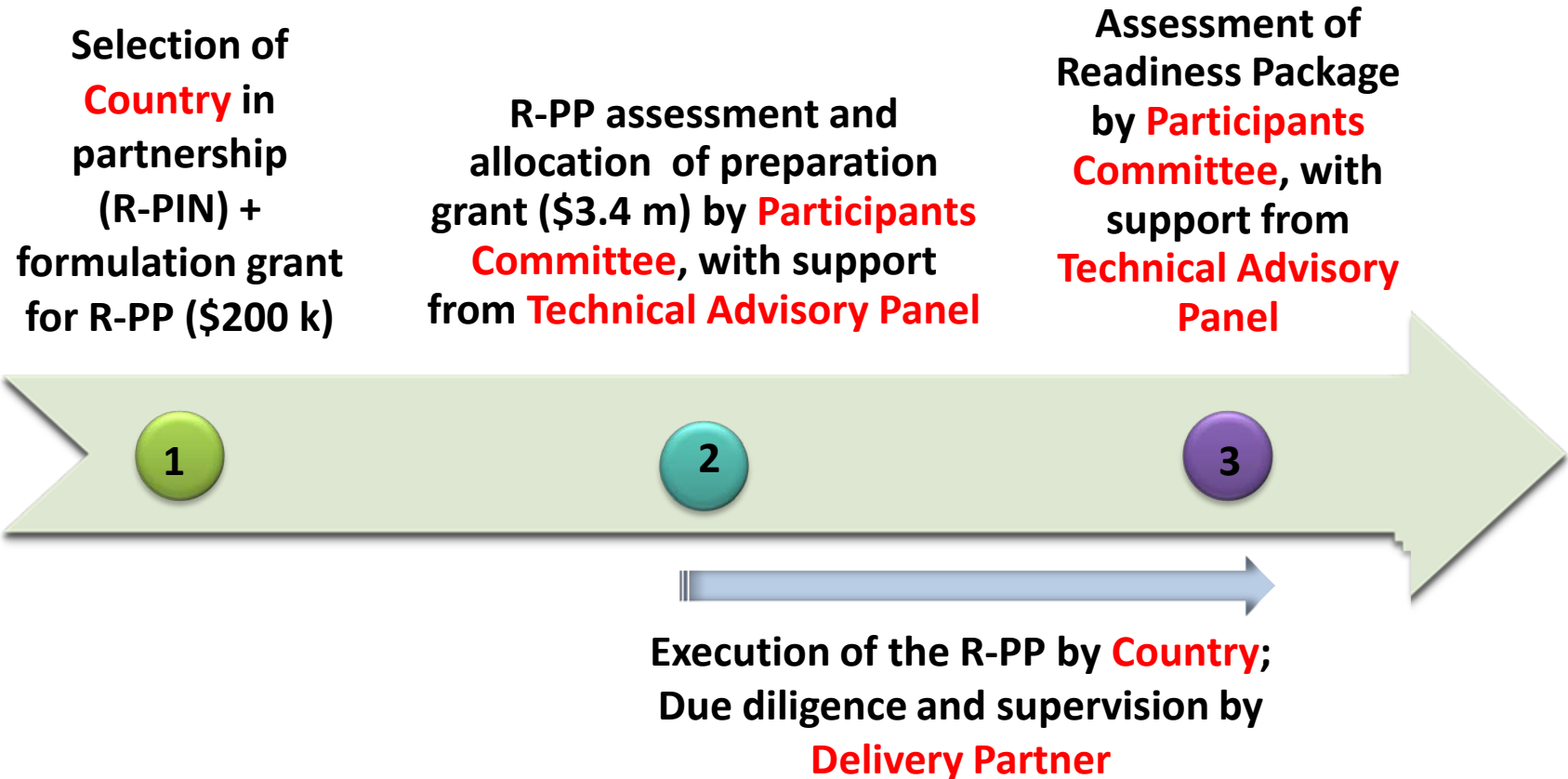

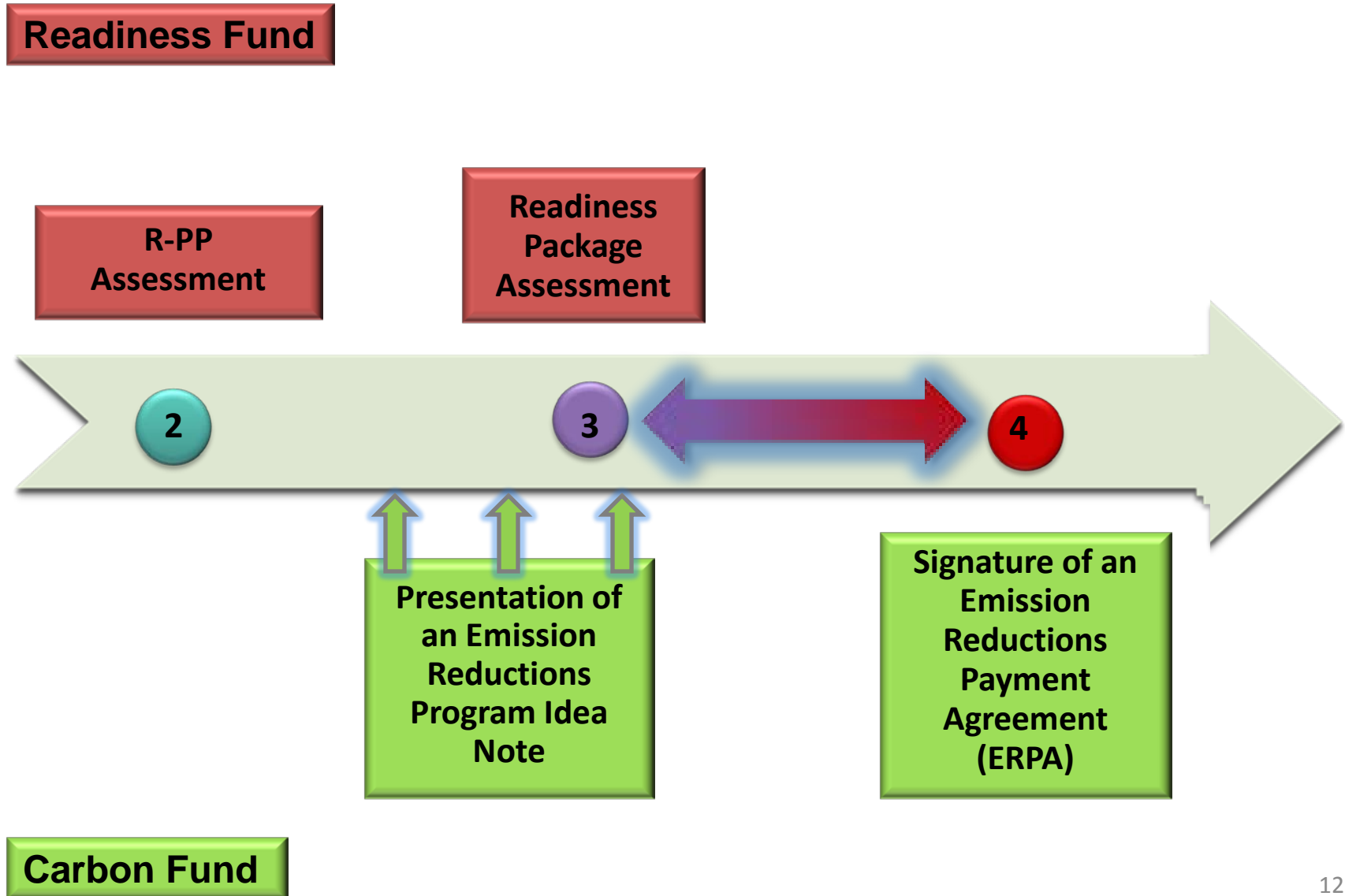
Formulation and implementation of national Readiness Preparation Proposal (R-PP)

From Readiness to Carbon Finance



Carbon Fund

- **Pilot performance-based payments for ~5 countries that have made significant progress towards Readiness**
- **Scale: Programs must be large enough (e.g., at level of a jurisdiction)**
- **Sub-national transactions must fit in:**
 - **National strategy**
 - **National accounting system (reference level, MRV)**
- **This is about helping countries**
 - **Establish proper frameworks for future financing under phases 2 and 3 of REDD+**
 - **Generate high-quality emission reductions that are good for the climate, good for the people and good for the local environment**

Multiple Delivery Partner Arrangement in the FCPF Readiness Fund

Common Approach on Safeguards



IDB



- Substantial equivalence with the World Bank's Safeguards (as a minimum, not a maximum)
- FCPF/UN-REDD guidelines on engagement of Indigenous Peoples and local communities
- Access to information
- Accountability
