

Financial Contributions to the FCPF

Continued contributions to the FCPF. Committed and pledged funds to the Facility are about \$820* million. This includes an additional financial contribution from Finland of over \$3 million to the Readiness Fund, now at \$369 million. The Carbon Fund is now at \$451 million.



^{*}Weakening of the Euro, the Norwegian Kroner, and the Pound Sterling, against the US dollar negatively affected the total fund value as outstanding contributions from EC, Finland, Germany, Norway, and the United Kingdom are in local currency.



Reporting on selected impact-level indicators

FCPF brings Ministries of Finance into high-level REDD+ discussion:

- April 2015 WB Spring Meetings: informal forest breakfast meeting bringing together representatives from Ministries of Finance in forest countries (Colombia, DRC, Ghana) to talk about including forests and landscapes in national investment programs and financial incentives.
- Representatives from Mexico, Germany, Norway, UK, and WB also participated in the informal meeting.
- With the success of the meeting, more high-level outreach is to come.



Reporting on selected impact-level indicators

- Green Climate Fund has adopted a Performance Measurement
 Framework where performance measurement for REDD+ will be informed by the FCPF Methodological Framework. [related to impact 1.1]
- Examples of how FCPF learning and experience has fed into UNFCCC REDD+ decisions [related to impact 1.1]
 - In December 2014, at the Lima COP Forest Pavilion, FCPF co-hosted an event with Ministerio del Ambiente (MINAM) of Perú to showcase how countries with different needs are using a common Methodological Framework and General Conditions to prepare Emission Reductions Programs at national (Costa Rica and Guatemala) and subnational (Chile and Peru) scales.


- As of February 2015, Government of Finland joined the Participants Committee

Reporting on selected outcome indicators: Towards ER Programs

- As committed at PC18, FAQs on ERPA General Conditions available on FCPF website
- As requested at PC18, the FMT is developing ER **Program Buffer Guidelines** and established a review group for this. At PC20 there will be a comprehensive update on the Buffer Guidelines.



Reporting on selected outcome indicators: Towards ER Programs



- Coordination of the Evaluation of FPCF is underway, which will encompass Readiness Fund as well as Carbon Fund. A complete update on this progress will be provided to the PC at this meeting.
- At the CF12 meeting in April, Carbon Fund Participants extended the term of the Carbon Fund to December 2025.*

- 8 additional Readiness Preparation Grants (Bhutan, Burkina Faso, Colombia, Fiji, Nigeria, Sudan, Togo, Vanuatu) signed since PC18 [output 1.2]
- Mexico, Republic of Congo, Vietnam reached Midterm, presenting progress and requesting additional funding at PC19 [output 1.3]



FCPF countries have made great strides in developing ER programs with the Carbon Fund since the last PC:

- Mexico and Vietnam signed Letters of Intent (total of 7 LOIs signed);
 Guatemala and Nepal are expected to sign in May 2015.
- Potential to expand pipeline beyond current 11 ER-PINs → 9 Countries presented Early Ideas at the CF12 meeting in April 2015 [output 2.2]

IP and CSOs to engage in REDD+ processes

- In April, at the **High-Level Dialogue between the WB and IPs Leaders**, the FCPF presented on its engagement with Indigenous Peoples. The FCPF engagement with Indigenous Peoples has been evaluated as innovative. A presentation was given on "Lessons learned from Phase 1 of the FCPF Capacity Building Program".
- From May 4-6, a WB Colloquium on the forest sector was held in Kenya with over 180 representatives from forest dependent communities who requested FCPF support to Kenya.



IP and CSOs to engage in REDD+ processes

- FMT represented at the **14th Session of the United Nations Permanent Forum on Indigenous Issues**. Since 2008, Indigenous Peoples have built a strong collaborative relationship with FCPF, to the point where they are recognized as key actors in activities supported by the Partnership at multiple levels.
- May 6th-8th, 2015: Preparation Workshop: FCPF Capacity Building on REDD+ for Indigenous Peoples, Southern CSOs and Local Communities
 - This workshop was attended by regional intermediaries under the Capacity Building Program, and Bank staff supporting the preparation of the projects. During the workshop, the Bank and the grant recipient organizations collaborated to provide the definitions and inputs required to fine-tune project design, and started drafting technical documents.

Participants actively engaging in South-South learning

activities [output 4.2]

From February 23-28, 2015 representatives from government and private sector in **Ethiopia** and **Mozambique** traveled to Brazil for a South-South knowledge exchange on **sustainable forest plantations** which included meetings and learning sessions with government, private sector and research institutions on how forest plantations can **promote rural development and reduce pressure on native forests**.



At what scale will the REDD+ Program be implemented?

The basic decisions and steps for REDD+ design are relevant at both national and subnational scales. Countries may decide to work on their historical emissions and removals estimates in a stepwise fashion which can include developing a reference level (RL) initially for only specific regions of the country. A decision is required on whether to allow subnational REDD+ at all, whether REDD+ can be piloted at the subnational level, or whether it is necessary to wait for full national accounting with the national results as the sum of subnational areas.

Options for scale are presented below. Note that the maps on this page are only for demonstration purposes and do not reflect the country chosen.

TNC and FCPF Report on Early Lessons from Jurisdictional REDD+ and Low Emissions Development

On January 26, the FCPF and The Nature Conservancy jointly released a new report, Early Lessons from Jurisdictional REDD+ and Low Emissions Development Programs, featuring eight jurisdictional REDD+/LED programs worldwide designed to reduce forest-related emissions (six of these jurisdictions have been admitted into the FCPF Carbon Fund pipeline). The joint study finds that with appropriate investment and support, jurisdictional REDD+/LED programs have the potential to become transformational models of forest-friendly development. Fast Facts

- Large-scale emission reductions programs under the Carbon Fund combined have the potential to transform over 100 million hectares of land in 11 countries.
- 7 of the 11 Carbon Fund countries have since Letters of Intent (LOTA) towards an Emission Reduction. Agreement.
- To date 6 countries in the Readiness Fund have reached the mid-term of their Readiness Grant and 5 countries have been allocated an additional grant of \$5 million.



Disbursements of Readiness Grants



Disbursements of Readiness Grants (2)

(i) Accelerating signing of readiness grant agreements

- Grant agreements signed thus far: 32 + 2 for additional \$5 million each
- Due diligence completed, and expected to be signed by end 2015: 3
- Yet to complete due diligence: 11
- Lost guaranteed access to funding: 11

Of the 11 'new' FCPF countries, 7 have already signed Preparation Grant Agreements and took an average of only 11 months to get from R-PP Assessment to Grant Signature.

Mid Term Reviews and Additional Grants:

- 9 countries reached mid-term status with DRC and Ghana having signed additional grants of \$5.2 million each.
- Costa Rica, Indonesia and Liberia are in the process of signing additional grants.
- Mexico, RoC and Vietnam will present MTRs at the PC meeting.

Disbursements of Readiness Grants (3)

(ii) Ensuring that the number of new REDD+ countries included in the FCPF can swiftly overcome potential disbursement bottlenecks

 Continue to assist countries with a set of actions to address procurement and financial management challenges as presented and discussed at PC16 in December 2013 (refer to <u>FMT Note 2013-6</u>).

Concluding Messages

- Attention to elevating the REDD+ dialogue, by bringing Ministries of Finance into the discussion
- IP & CSO engagement remains cornerstone for FCPF
- As ER programs in the Carbon Fund pipeline mature and countries come forward with Readiness Packages, focus on efforts to create knowledge resources and to redouble support to FCPF countries to keep up momentum on REDD+ Readiness and ER Programs
- Potential to expand the Carbon Fund pipeline
- Projected acceleration of Grant Disbursement in FY15 and beyond
- More staff coming on board to support these efforts
