Report and Recommendations by Meridian Institute

Meridian Institute Charge

- Meridian Institute is an NGO whose mission is to help people solve complex and controversial problems, make informed decisions, and implement solutions that improve lives, the economy, and the environment.
- Meridian was asked by the FMT to:
 - Gather insights to better understand the needs and expectations of Private Sector Observers (PSOs)
 - Explore ways in which PSOs could support efforts to increase private sector awareness of REDD+ country readiness and investment in climate-smart landscape management programs
 - Provide strategic advice about the PSOs role.



Meridian's Process

Interviewed CF
Participants,
REDD+ Countries,
and Observers to
understand needs
and expectations

Articulated potential PSO functions; tested these with people familiar with FCPF and private sector

Based on understanding needs, functions, interests, and capacity, articulated PSO expectations.

We found that PSO needs and potential functions far exceed what can be expected of two private sector organizations participating in CF meetings.

Therefore, we developed a set of recommendations that describe a suite of activities – including a focused role for the PSOs – aimed at improving private sector awareness of and involvement in CF activities.



Findings – What We Heard

- A PSO role focused on reviewing and commenting on Program
 Documents is of limited value to REDD+ countries and is less appealing to private sector organizations
- FCPF should keep a carbon market PSO and add an ad hoc supply chain
 PSO
- REDD+ Countries should identify and promote involvement and investment opportunities for the private sector in REDD+ programs
- REDD+ Countries are seeking support for identifying and communicating private sector investment opportunities in REDD+ programs
- To support REDD+ Countries, FMT could develop a package of coordinated activities aimed at increasing private sector investment in REDD+ programs
- PSOs could play a strategic role as part of a well-coordinated package of activities – to increase private sector awareness and increase involvement and investment in climate-smart landscape management activities.



Recommendations to the FMT

1. Build on current and ongoing CF activities to **create a coordinated package of activities** to increase awareness of
the FCPF program and relevant activities in REDD+ countries,
identify private sector investment opportunities, and identify and
connect with potential private sector partners and investors.

The package could include:

- A communications strategy to inform key stakeholders about conditions created to facilitate private sector investment
- Country-level private sector engagement and investment strategies
- A broker-type function to connect REDD+ countries and companies and investors
- A (formal or informal) platform or dialogue amongst FCPF (and/or other World Bank facilities or funds) and other investors



Recommendations to the FMT

- 2. Clarify the role and function of PSOs in the CF and in the context of the fuller package of CF activities to increase awareness and identify and connect with potential private sector partners and investors
- Organize efficient systems for PSOs to participate through strategy sessions with FMT and REDD+ countries
- 4. Allow the PSOs role and the method for their involvement to evolve based on changing REDD+ Country needs and evolving private sector structures for participation in FCPF
- 5. Suggested Private Sector Observers
 - Permanent PSO, Carbon Markets: International Emissions Trading Association
 - Ad Hoc PSO, Sustainable Food and Agricultural Supply Chains: World Economic Forum



Concluding Comments

- Meridian was initially asked to assist in the selection of two new PSOs to the Carbon Fund.
- Our interviews showed an opportunity to create a more strategic role for the PSOs in support of FCPF efforts to mobilize resources, knowledge and innovation for addressing climate change and promoting sustainable development in REDD+ Countries.
- We hope that a holistic approach for the involvement of PSOs as part of a coordinated set of activities will help countries during implementation of REDD+ programs and help companies achieve zero deforestation commitments.
