Analysis of the final version of Uganda's R-PP

The Republic of Uganda presented its Readiness Preparation Proposal (R-PP) for assessment by the FCPF Participants Committee, at its 9th meeting, held in June 2011, in Oslo, Norway. At this meeting, the PC adopted Resolution PC/9/2011/3, where they decided to allocate grant funding for Uganda to enable it to move ahead with preparation for readiness. The PC requested Uganda to submit a revised R-PP addressing the key issues identified in a summary report to the resolution. Uganda has submitted a revised R-PP to the FCPF FMT on 11 May, 2012.

The main issues raised in the PC Resolution and the response provided is included in the revised R-PP. This analysis should allow the FMT to assess whether the issues raised by the PC Resolution have been attended to, which would allow the WB to continue its due diligence process in view of making the REDD Readiness grant available to the country. Key issues raised by the PC and how they were addressed in the final R-PP version (May 11, 2012) is presented below:

Develop a Consultation and Participation Plan, including a plan for consultation on and participation in Uganda's Strategic Environmental and Social Assessment process, to be validated by key stakeholders at a national level .	Uganda has revised the R-PP to address the issue raised in the PC resolution. Comments were received by the World Bank in response to the revised R-PP. The final R-PP was submitted on May 11, 2012. The Consultation and Participation plan has been developed (Annex 1 to the R-PP) and validated at the national level.
