## Main activities implemented during the Reporting Period

#### **Component 1**

- (a) Briefing Meeting between the Director General, Ministry of Agriculture and REDD+ Unit: A Meeting was organized, on 13<sup>th</sup> October 2016, to brief the Director General of the Ministry of Agriculture about the REDD+ Project. Power point presentation was made by the Project to inform about the objectives and modalities of implementation of the Project. The Meeting was fruitful and the objective of disseminating the information, about REDD+ Program, at senor level of the Government was also achieved.
- (b) **Briefing Meeting between the Minister of Agriculture and REDD+ Unit:** Another round of briefing meeting was organized, on 30<sup>th</sup> October 2016, by the REDD+ Unit. The objective

was to brief the Minister of the Ministry of Agriculture about the REDD+ Project. Project Management made presentation about the REDD+ Project, its objectives and purposes. The Meeting was very useful for disseminating the REDD+ objectives, co-benefits. The Minister was very keen to know about the Project implementation and the duration of the Project. The Director General of the Ministry of Agriculture was also present in the meeting. The briefing was organized in a very cordial atmosphere.

- (c)<u>Construction of REDD+ Office Building in Port Vila</u>: The construction of REDD+ Office building started in last week of November 2016. The materials required for the construction was funded through the the REDD+ Project while the labour cost was borne by the Department of Forests. Good progress has been made by the contractor and the work is expected to be completed by soon.
- (d)<u>Structural and Architectural Drawings and Estimates for renovation of four buildings:</u> The REDD+ Engineer has submitted the structural and architectural drawing and Cost estimate for renovating four Forest Department's buildings in Santo, Malekula, Tanna and Erromango. These buildings are the office buildings of Regional Forest Officers (RFO) who are very important partners for implementing the REDD+ readiness activities in the islands. The cost for the materials will be supported by REDD+ Project through the FCPF fund whereas the labour cost will be borne by the Forest Department. The Forest Department is in the process of selecting the contractor for awarding the works.

#### Component 2

- (a) <u>MOU between VANGO and Department of Forests and MOU between REDD+ Project</u> <u>and CSO Platform:</u> Two MOUs were signed on 1<sup>st</sup> March 2017, between (i) DOF and VANGO and between (ii) REDD+ Unit and CSO Platform. These MOUs were long over-due but finally both the documents were signed. These documents will be useful tools in implementing the REDD+ readiness activities in the field.
- **b) Study on Feedback and Grievance Redress Mechanism (FGRM)**: Study on FGRM has started with effect from 6<sup>th</sup> of February 2017. Mr Frank Williams, a Consultant from Canada is conducting the study. He has completed the consultation works in Sannto, Malekula, Erromango and Tanna. Three Workshops are scheduled in March 2017 to present the findings as well as for filtering the issues and obtaining consensus and feedbacks from the stakeholders.
- (c) <u>REDD+ CSO Consultations</u>: Two consultation workshops were organized (one each in Tanna and Erromango) to inform and update the CSO members in the islands about the REDD+ Program and its objectives. Consultation in Tanna was conducted with effect from 24<sup>th</sup> to 29<sup>th</sup> of October 2016 whereas in Erromango it was organized from 17<sup>th</sup> to 18<sup>th</sup> February 2017. The CSO members represent Women Groups, Youth Groups, and Church, including Government Departments like Forest, Livestock, Agriculture, Fishery, Environment, and Provincial Administration. In Tanna 59 CSO participants took part in the consultation workshops.
- (d) <u>National CSO REDD+ Report Writeshop:</u> CSO Coordinator will conduct three days writeshop with the Platform members. The objective is to develop Reports on consultations

which CSO conducted in five REDD+ islands. The writeshop will also be used for consensus building on the issues that were identified and flagged during the consultations. About 10 CSO Platform Members will participate in the writeshop.

## Component 3.2

- **(a) Study on Four Analytical Studies:** The Consultant has started the works on four Analytical Studies with effect from February 2017 after presenting the inception report and work plan. The works was awarded to a consulting Firm (UNIQUE) from Germany. They have completed the consultation in Santo, Malekula, Erromango and Tanna. The work is still under progress and is expected to be completed by June 2017.
- **(b)** The SESA Study: Contract has been signed with the Consulting Firm in the last week of March 2017. One round of preliminary Meeting was conducted on 27<sup>th</sup> March 2017 between the IAS/USP and REDD+ Team and Forest Department. The work is scheduled to begin by April 2017 and complete by March 2018.

## Component 3.3

(a) <u>Production and Distribution of REDD+ Extension Materials</u>: The following categories of REDD+ extension materials were produced and distributed to the CSO Networks Members, PTC Members including the RFOs. The extension will be very useful in disseminating the REDD+ messages in the islands. The description of the extension materials are as follows:

- **B)** International Day of the Forests: The Department of Forests, in collaboration with other Government Departments and organizations celebrated the international Day of the Forests on 21<sup>st</sup> March 2017. The theme of the Day was "Forests and Energy". Main highlights of the Day were marked by show-casing of different forest products by various industries. The key messages for the day were: (a) wood energy from the forests: a major source of the worlds renewable energy (b) wood energy: powering economic development (c) wood and trees: optimal urban living and lower energy bills (d) wood energy: mitigating climate change and fostering sustainable development (e) Forests for energy: now and in future global green economy. There was poster presentation and quiz competition also by the school children. The REDD+ Project funded part of the expenditure for the celebration.
- **c) REDD+ Website Development:** The consultant has completed the development of website. Basic elements required for the website has been completed. REDD+ Project has asked the consultant to conduct one day briefing and familiarization training for the REDD+ Extension Officer and hand over the website management to the Project immediately.

#### New proposed component

**(a) TOR for Design and Establishment of MRV and FRL:** This activity is not included in the 'Assessment Note' for funding by FCPF WB REDD+ Project. Therefore based on WB TTL advice, the REDD+ Project was asked to prepare a detailed Terms of Reference (TOR) for designing and establishment of National Forest Monitoring System including MRV and FRL and database for Vanuatu. The restructuring proposal is still under progress and is expected to be completed by April 2017.

At the national level, CSO Platform has been established. The Members of this Platform meets as and when required and are composed of CSOs/NGOs, women Group, Youth Groups and local IPs are also represented as a Member of the Platform. There is one CSO coordinator who acts a bridge between the CSO Platform and REDD+ Program and also VANGO Secretariat. The Members of the Platform discuss the issues pertaining to the objectives, importance and cobenefits of the REDD+ Program. The Executive Members of the Platform are elected by the CSO Platform. The Platform is very important Forum for stakeholders to participate and engage themselves in REDD+ decision making process.

Examples of stakeholder engagement platforms in country which meet regularly to discuss and provide inputs to the REDD+ readiness process (FCPF M&E Framework 3.2.a.):

Technical Committee Meetings <i>(as and when</i> <i>required)</i>	At the National Level there is a Technical Committee (TC) that has been established to oversee and provide inputs to the REDD+ readiness preparation. The members of the Committee represent the Government Departments like Agriculture, Forestry, Livestock, Environment and Tourism. This is very important Platform to discuss issues about the REDD+ Program.
Executive Meeting of the CSO Platform (as and when required)	Executive Meeting of the CSO Platform is another important Forum for stakeholder engagement. The Executive Members of the Platform meets occasionally and discuss issues pertaining to the REDD+ Program. The Meetings are organized by the National CSO Coordinator.
Provincial Technical Committee Meetings (PTC). (as and when required)	At the Provincial and local level, there is Provincial Technical Committee (PTC) whose members are representatives of the CSOs/NGOs, local Provincial Administration, Government Department representatives, women Groups, Youth Groups, church. They discuss the benefits, and objectives of the REDD+ Program as and when required. The local Regional Forest Officers acts as Chairman of the PTC. The Minutes of the PTC Meetings are received by the National CSO Coordinator for record and also for taking further necessary action.
Trainings/Workshops (as per work plan of the project)	The Provincial Technical Committee (PTC) is established up under the overall chairmanship of the Regional Forest Officers in all REDD+ islands. All relevant stakeholders in these islands are engaged through Workshops, trainings etc. Since the PTC Members represents Government Departments like Forestry, Agriculture, Horticulture, Livestock, Fishery, Women groups, Youth groups, Churches, local Provincial Administration they discuss the issues

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	that are pertaining to their Department or their organizations.				
International day of the Forests <i>(Once in a year)</i>	Every year on 21 <sup>st</sup> March the International day of the Forest is celebrated where dignitaries, guests, students take part in the celebration. The day is marked with fun fare, tree planting by the guest and students. The students also organize quiz competition. Different Departments and organizations show-case their works and products. The day has become good Platform to disseminate the objectives of the REDD+ Program.				
Consultation Workshops (as per the work plan)	Consultations Workshops are organized in the REDD+ islands for discussing the issues pertaining to REDD+ Program. The Representatives of the CSOs in the REDD+ islands engage the indigenous local people, CSO/NGOs Provincial Government officials, extension officers from Agriculture Department, Forestry, Livestock, Environment, women groups, youth groups and church take part in the consultation. This is one of the most important Platforms for stakeholders engagement for discussing the REDD+ Program issues and objectives.

The resources are made available to enable active participation of IPs, CSOs and local communities in the following manner:					

- Work Plan and Budget are prepared and the resources are made available to the CSOs, IPs through the CSO National Coordinator. They organize various activities as per the work plan that enables the active participation of CSO and IPs.
- $\circ~$  CSO Coordinator receives budgetary support to organize consultation workshops and conduct CSO Platform Executive Meetings.
- $\circ~$  Necessary equipment like laptops, cameras and printers are also supplied to the CSO Coordinators and CSO representatives in all REDD+ islands.

- The drafting of the National Forest Policy coincided with the drafting of REDD+ R-PP therefore there were opportunities to include REDD+ related activities complying with the REDD+ objectives in the National Forest Policy document.
- Drafting works for the Planted Forest Act also started about the same time as drafting of REDD+ Readiness R-PP therefore the Act also has many elements of sustainable management of Forest resources.
- $\circ\,$  The Forest Act was also reviewed and the outputs from the review exercise can be incorporated while drafting the Forest Act.

Design of national REDD+ Strategies addresses indicators for enhancement of livelihoods of local communities and for biodiversity conservation (*FCPF M&E Framework Indicator 3.B.*):

<u>Provide examples of how national REDD Strategies address livelihoods of local communities and biodiversity conservation.</u>

- Consultation workshops were held in all the five REDD+ islands. During the Consultations issues, objectives and co-benefits about the REDD+ program are discussed intensively. People are also explained about the strategy options in their own areas.
- The study on deforestation and forest degradation is under progress and based on the drivers identified through the study the Strategy Options will also be developed and refined. These options will help the local people to address the issues pertaining to their livelihood. It is also seen that local people have adequate knowledge about the landuses that are most appropriate options.
- The Strategy Options that will be developed based on the identified drivers will be through consultation with the local people and should be able to address and enhance their livelihood issues and biodiversity conservation.
- The Regional Forest Officers are engage in activities that pertains to biodiversity conservation like (a) identification and conservation of plants species that have conservation significance (b) identification and conservation of animals that have conservation significance (c) The local people and the Government Organizations are also involved in conservation efforts in (i) watershed management (ii) management of introduced species (iii) management of cultural heritage (iv) conservation of significant species and places.
- The local people are fully consulted and engaged and technical supports are provided to the local communities and farmers in their conservation efforts.

## 3. PROGRESS AT R-PP sub component level

#### **3.1. REDD Readiness Progress**

Progress made during the reporting period in developing the country Readiness Package:

- **1. Implementation Framework:** The Department of Forests is the Lead Agency for implementation of REDD+ readiness activities in the field. The institution Framework is in place but more capacity building exercise is required. Implementation capacity of the Forest Department's staffs, in the field, is very low. In addition to the above-mentioned, the CSO System is also very active and institutional framework required for implementing the REDD+ activities are in place. In a similar line, capacity building is utmost important for these categories of staffs and CSOs as well. During the reporting period consultations, trainings workshops were held in different REDD+ islands through CSO system as well as through the Regional Forest Officers. The CSO National Platform is also an important institution for implementation of REDD+ activities.
- **2.** National REDD+ Strategy: In order to inform the National REDD+ Strategy, the following studies are conducted. Study on Feedback and Grievance Redress Mechanism is underway. It started in February 2017 and is scheduled to be completed by May 2017.

Beside the above-mentioned study, four Analytical Studies are under progress. The results of these studies will be inputs to the development of National REDD+ Strategy. The studies started in February 2017 and are scheduled to be completed by June 2017. The four Analytical Studies are (a) drivers of deforestation and forest degradation (b) Strategy Options (c) Legal harmonization of land tenure and carbon rights and commercial landuse activities and (d) Benefits sharing mechanism.

- **3. SESA and the Development of ESMF:** Contract Agreement has been signed and the work is awarded to the Consulting Firm IAS/USP from Fiji. One round of preliminary Meeting is conducted on 27<sup>th</sup> March 2017 and the work is scheduled to begin by April 2017. The duration of the consultancy is 12 months and the outputs for the SESA works will be available by March 2018.
- **<u>4.</u>** <u>**Monitoring, Reporting and Verification (MRV):**</u> The sub-component is not supported by FCPF funding. REDD+ Project Management is trying its best to secure fund, to implement this sub-component, by restructuring the REDD+ Project.
- **5. Design and establishment of Forest Reference Level (FRL):** This sub-component is also not supported by FCPF funding therefore the REDD+ Project is trying its best to secure fund, to implement this sub-component, by restructuring the REDD+ Project.

- Obtaining the imprest money for the work is also delaying the work.

## 5. MAIN LESSONS LEARNED

- The REDD+ islands being scattered and located very far away as such conducting consultations and training workshops is taking lot of time and resources.
- Involvement of CSOs/NGOs in disseminating REDD+ objectives was very helpful.
