The main objective of the FCPF in Mexico is to support its preparation process, financing the development of a participatory and inclusive analytical process for finalizing the National REDD+ Strategy (ENAREDD+).

The FCPF has the following 3 expected results:

- 1. A final version of ENAREDD+ reflects the comments and feedback from the various sectors and stakeholders.
- 2. A technically strong ESMF has been finalized and validated by a broad range of stakeholders.
- 3. A state-level comprehensive feedback and grievance mechanism for REDD+ is piloted in one Early Action Area.

The FCPF support is limited to analytical studies, capacity building, and consultation processes at the national and subnational levels.

The CTC-REDD+ was formally established on May 13, 2010 and brought together over 60 civil society and producers organizations, academic and governmental institutions to discuss REDD issues and provide inputs into the policy making process. This multistakeholder technical advisory committee was created as an open body for consultation and feedback for citizen participation. The CTC-REDD meets regularly to discuss the preparation of the national REDD strategy and other related programs.

Additionally, on July 30 of 2013, a National REDD Strategy Working Group (GT-ENAREDD) in the Consejo Nacional Forestal (CONAF) was created to discuss the information contained in the third draft of the National REDD Strategy. The GT-ENAREDD has participated actively in providing feedback on the second draft of the ENAREDD+ document.

The FCPF readiness grant activities and the SESA work plan were presented to the main participative platforms: On December 16th, 2013 were presented to the REDD+ National Technical Advisory Council (CTC), on November 8th of 2013 to the REDD+ State Strategy Work Group of the CTC, and on February 10th of 2014 to the ENAREDD+ Work Group of the National Forest Council (CONAF).

In 2014, the "round table for Indigenous and comunity consultation" (Mesa campesina e indígena para la consulta de la ENAREDD+) was created. This work space aims to provide feedback on the consultation process and to participate in the construction of the consultation Plan.

The FCPF will support the construction of the final version of ENAREDD+ which will reflect the comments and feedback from the various sectors and stakeholders.

In this respect, since 2010, Mexico has been working on the participatory development of its National REDD+ Strategy (ENAREDD+). That same year the CICC published Mexico's Vision on REDD+: Towards a National Strategy, which included key targets and definitions that guided the development of the strategy.

Subsequently, in November 2011, Elements for the Design of the National REDD+ Strategy (ENAREDD+), which set the targets for 2020, was prepared and published. Further improvements have been made to this document based on feedback in the CTC-REDD+ and input and comments from the CICC GT-REDD+, and a new version of ENAREDD+ was prepared and presented in October 2012 (draft 1).

In 2013, this draft was submitted to a feedback process with stakeholders via the existing national and state platforms such as the National CTC, the state CTCs, the CONAF ENAREDD+ Working Group, the GT-REDD+ and the CICC. In July of that year, a new version of ENAREDD+ (draft 2) was presented. In 2014, the last draft had been presented to the CONAF ENAREDD+ Working Group and comments and necessary amendments are being made to create an inclusive and comprehensive instrument for submission to a national consultation process.

In 2014, the "round table for Indigenous and comunity consultation" (Mesa campesina e indígena para la consulta de la ENAREDD+) was created. This work space aims to provide feedback on the consultation process and to participate in the construction of the consultation Plan.



The ENAREDD+ establishes that the rural sustainable development seeks a "comprehensive improvement of social welfare and economic activities in the territory according to the applicable provisions, ensuring the preservation of natural resources, biodiversity and the ecosystem services of the territory."

Aditionally, the objective of REDD+ in Mexico consists in reducing emissions of GEI from deforestation and forest degradation and the role of conservation, sustainable management of forests and enhancement of forest carbon stocks, contributing to the conservation of the forest biodiversity, and with the warranty of the application and effective accomplishment of the Safeguards and principles in this strategy and in the current legal framework.

CFPs welcomed the high quality of the proposal, and offered feedback on how to improve the early idea with a view to an ER-PIN presentation at CF9.  During the 9th Carbon Fund meeting Mexico presented its ER-PIN and resulted selected into the Carbon Fund pipeline. The CF, allocated up to \$650,000 for development of an ER-Program Document, and authorized the Trustee to negotiate a Letter of Intent (LOI).
