The FCPF support is meant to support the REDD+ Readiness implementation programme currently supported by the national government and the National UNREDD Programme beyond 2014. It is to support national and sub-national capacity building, insitutional linkage strengthening, stakeholder engagement and communication maximisation. The FCPF support will also continue to refine the national REDD+ Strategy, implementation of safeguards and development of SESA frameworks. It will support the establishment of PNG's REL/RL and its linkage with activities at the sub-national level and finally consolidate and finalize the national MRV system which is currently supported through the National UNREDD Programme.

SABLs are a form of land acquisition that allows for a lease-lease back arrangement for customary land between Government and the landowners for agriculture development purposes.
