#### **SUMMARY**:

Costa Rica advances in the development of the National REDD + Strategy:

- REDD+ Executive Committee has a constant participation within the construction of the National Strategy
- Three of the indigenous communities from Central Pacific started The Consultation Process (information preconsultation); these communities didn't start before since they were holding negotiations with the central government.
- The final document for the Strategic Environmental and Social Assessment is finished as well as the Environmental and Social Management Framework.
- Implementation and positioning of the grievance redress mechanism
- The country is strengthening the Safeguards Information System and the Benefit Sharing Mechanism
- An analysis of Costa Rica's institutional framework was started, to establish the future implementation of the REDD + Strategy, under the National Program for Forests and Rural Development
- Costa Rica has a first version of reference level, that includes: avoided deforestation, increase in

- carbon stocks from growing secondary forests, increase in carbon stocks due to growth of forest plantations and conservation.
- With the second donation the reference level will be consolidate including the 5 REDD + activities established in Cancun. MINAE's Minister has instructed the institutions under his jurisdiction, that they should establish the corresponding interinstitutional arrangements regarding the measuring, reporting and verification; so this will allow the establishment of the National Monitoring System of Land Use Changes. This will be housed as an instance of the National Centre for Geoenvironmental Information (CENIGA) thorough the National Environmental Information System (SINIA).
- The first donation has been undertaken in more than 63%

# Important issues /problems

- Slow information exchange and coordination among the institutions
- Slow learning process of the new government authorities regarding REDD + initiative and its progress
- The self-assessment of the relevant stakeholders has been a slow process, which has led to changes in the proposed methodology.
- The Delivery of the first reference level has taken longer than expected due to country's information management.

- 80% of the consultation plan implemented ( 2 of the 3 phases are completed). Only 3 of the 24 indigenous territories are pending in joining the process of information and pre-consultation.
- 9 costarricans trained with south south experience.
- 63% of the donation disbursed.
- 68% of the donation has been executed.
- Approximately 3% is in execution.
- By the end of 2014 an external audit of the project was developed.
- Two cooperation agreements, one for US \$ 927.000 US dollars and another extension of US \$ 40,000 more.
- Self Assessment developed with all stakeholders.
- 2 interinstitutional meeting held to analyze the first results of the reference level.
- 1 interinstitutional meeting held to discuss the ministerial guideline on how to advance in the construction of the National Monitoring Land Use Changes
- Meeting held with indigenous representatives and the Minister of Environment.

- Government Agencies: The Government has the interest to frame REDD+ Strategy in a larger program complying with national objectives. Thus there's been a working coordination with institutions such as SINAC, MINAE, IMN, MAG, DCC, CENIGA, SINIA, CONAGEBIO.
- Indigenous communities: conclusion of pre-consultation with the 19 Indigenous Territories, also the self-assessment process was concluded. The inclusion of three Indigenous territories form the Central Pacific Territories has been achieved, so they can join the consultation process. The work plan for approaching the 5 special issues defined as a priority during SESA is developing. However, those issues won't be resolved within the strategy, because they imply long-term achievements such as solving land tenure issues. However, REDD+ Secretariat has held several meetings with the central government, so they will carry on with the implementation of the 5 special issues defined.
- Small agroforestry producers: This sector encompasses 4 different communication channels. Self-assessment process was conducted.
- Women and Youth: it is expected to enhance the participation of women and youth with the second donation. However there is a gender strategy for the preparation phase and REDD+ Secretariat has established internal mechanisms to measure the participation of women in all the activities.
- Civil Society Organizations: There are several organizations that support the preparation phase, such as UICN that leads the implementation of VCS Standard sponsored by the Norwegian Government to pilot the JNR Standard as an accounting framework within REDD+ Strategy. The National Institute of Biodiversity (INBio), sponsored by the Norwegian Government, supports the development of different actions regarding cobenefits and systematization of regional experiences; CATIE with the Regional Program for Climate Change support the enhancement of the grievance redress mechanism, as well as the Financing plan for REDD+ Strategy with UN-REDD and Terra Global Capital. UN-REDD supports as well the development of business models for the incorporation of the private sector. It also promotes the work, with business chambers that may generate business activities related to REDD. Wise Project has supported with the stakeholder's self-assessment.

  •Forestry Private entities: The FCPF and UN-REDD have supported several actions within REDD+ Strategy, so that the private sector can consolidate its participation. They supported a training session on how to integrate carbon in the sector's productive chains.
- Donors: Technical assistance has been provided by GiZ, UNREDD, USAID, and NORAD.

The hiring process has improved, however the processes are really slow. Thus there is a delay in product development, which is related to a slow response when operational adjustments are required

The process of achieving interinstitutional agreements its complex therefore, it takes slow negotiation processes.

There are pending Interinstitutional arrangements, for defining the information that will feed the National Forest Monitoring System

The Benefit Sharing Mechanism and the Registry System, require further development.

#### 5. MAIN LESSONS LEARNED
