Reporting schedule: It is expected that the annual progress country reporting will be submitted to the FMT by August 15th each year. The reporting should be based on a self-assessment of progress. An update of this country reporting will also be submitted by March 15th each year.

SUMMARY:

The FCPF Grant for REDD+ Readiness Preparation to Lao PDR (or RPP implementation supports) has been effective from August 2014 (the Grant Agreement signed). Following the effective date of the Grant, Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry (MAF) assigned the Project Management Team (PMT) housing at REDD+ Office under Department of Forestry (DoF). Members of PMT consist of REDD+ Office under DoF and REDD+ Division under Department of Forest Resource Management (DFRM) of Ministry of Environment and Natural Resource (MONRE). The PMT member from DFRM is the acting head of the Secretariat to the National REDD+ Task Force (NRTF).

The NRTF of Lao PDR has been established in 2008, and currently chaired by the DG of DFRM. The key roles of NRTF are to oversee and guidance the REDD+ issues and activities in Lao PDR as well as consult amongst different stakeholders at all levels. NRTF is empowered to establish a number of Technical Working Groups (TWG) including TWG on Reference Emissions Levels, MRV, Stakeholder Consultation, Land-use Planning, Carbon Registry, REDD+ Strategy and benefit sharing. NRTF members meet regularly (normally one every three months). During the reporting period, there were three meetings of NRTF.

During the reporting period, some key progresses can be described as follows:

- In regarding to institutional arrangement. NRTF agreed to establish six REDD+ TWGs by their next meeting scheduled on this 3rd September 2015. The six REDD+ TWGs include TWG on Legal Framework, Land Use Coordination, SES, Enforcement and Implementation of Mitigation, REL/MRV and Benefit Sharing.
- With support from FCPF, FIP (SUFORD-Su) and NFIS (National Forest Information System), wall-to-wall LULUCF mapping for 2010, 2005 was completed, 2000 is underway.
- Outreaching of REDD+ Readiness Activities and proposed action plans during the FCPF period through consultation meetings at the national and sub-national levels were organized (one meeting in central and eight meetings in provinces)
- Drafting ToR for REDD+ TWGs
- Consultation with the two project piloting provinces (Houaphan and Champasack) over provincial REDD+ institutional arrangement are under way (Houaphan province already establish Provincial REDD+ TF), and it is expected that the establishment of both Provincial REDD+ TF and Provincial REDD+ Office (Unit) will be completed by October 2015.

In regarding to the management and coordination, the FCPF has provided supports to the NRTF Secretariat (REDD+ Division of DFRM):

- Office equipment to provide REDD+ staff with good working environment
- Facilitating in coordination meetings of the Secretariat with other agencies and stakeholders and projects
- The meetings of NRTF (usually every three months)
- Capacity buildings
- Consultation workshops at both national and provincial levels (eg. Meeting about ER-PIN)
- Following up the international REDD+ moment

Some key tasks in pipeline of the FCPF Project in Laos include:

- Completing the procurement plan, particularly the selecting technical consulting firm to assist and to provide the technical supports on the development of the strategy, REL/MRV, SIS and other REDD+ Preparation tasks. The project advertised REOI for the interest firms during May-June 2015, and at the end of deadline, the projects received seventeen of submissions. The project planned to engage the technical consulting firm by December 2015. The hiring consulting firm will technically assist the works of the REDD TF Secretariat, in particular the following areas:
 - Readiness Process Management and Stakeholder Consultation
 - *REDD+ Strategy Development*
 - Implementation Arrangements
 - Reference Emission Level and Monitoring Systems
- During the three months, the project will support the REDD TF Secretariat prepare annual work plan include the annual work plans of the REDD TWGs.

Some challenges and problems

During the first year of the project implementation, many tasks and activities were behind the schedule. The main problems included: slow implement of procurement plan including hiring a technical consulting firm; insufficient of resource (include human resource) in the REDD+ TF Secretariat team under DFRM which is very importance body to push the plan of establishing the REDD+ TWGs, and REDD+ Office at the provinces. Many activities of REDD+ Readiness Preparation will be carried by the REDD+ TWGs (and after the Groups are established).

4. ISSUES, CHALLENGES AND RISKS

Even though some key issues such as the institutional arrangement and REL development have been progressed well recently. However, there are many challenges ahead, particularly to coordinate the works and activities amongst different REDD+ TWGs, to speed up building capacity to the key agencies responsible or play important roles in REDD+ Readiness Preparation (including local CSOs, ethnic group representative and private sectors). Significant supports to the REDD+ TF Secretariat are required, and to provide that in sufficient and timely manners is quite challenging.

5. MAIN LESSONS LEARNED

- Strong coordination and cooperation can be built through the REDD+ TF platform with regular meetings and clear work plans. Recently, REDD+ TF has taken significant steps to work closely with DoF and relevant Departments to establish REDD+ TWGs with support of the FCPF project, and there are also many important activities ahead requiring the coordination and cooperation.
- Strong Secretariat is required to ensure that the supports of different REDD+ Projects in Lao PDR to REDD+ Readiness Preparation are supplementary each other, and accordingly to the R-PP of the country.

FCPF M&E Framework
