Objectives of C & P

- Involvement of all stakeholders in decision making on REDD issues
- Participatory approach in decision making
- Collective Ownership
- Cooperation and commitment in the implementation and management of the entire process
- Involvement in the implementation process
- General awareness raising

What to Consult on

- What REDD+ is (basic information sharing)
- Incentives from REDD+
- Land use rights and Land tenure systems
- Forest Governance
- Benefit sharing schemes
- REDD projects and activities

Principles of C & P

- 1. Process to be incremental, building on earlier initiatives
- 2. Inclusive: Consult stakeholders affected, implementers & other interested parties.
- 3. Respect peoples' institutions and structures: no rep designated by the central power
- 4. Consultation takes time, resources constant feedback, capacity before you consult

Principles of C & P

- 5. Communication strategy: tailor made information should be accessible to enable participation
- 6. Evaluation of the process (by multiple levels and parties)
- 7. Participatory determination of the goals and focus (and it can continually evolve too)
- 8. Grievance and conflict management process should be included

Highlights of activities done

World Bank Mission May $11^{th} - 15^{th}$

Objective

 To reach agreement among key local partners and development partners on a coordinated work plan leading to the development of Ghana's R-pp

Outcomes

 Framework of actions to develop the R-pp within Ghana and a draft consultation and participation plan for R-pp development.

GFP Forest Sector People's Diagnostic Study – 4th – 12th June

– Objectives:

- Information sharing through presentations and Q & A session on REDD+
- Prioritised forestry sector issues relevant to REDD+

– Outcomes:

- Carried out successfully at 4 zonal centres
- Zonal level priorities of REDD+ activities
- Compilation of key questions from the zonal centres

REDD+ Workshops 7th to 16th July

- Activities done
 - 3 zonal workshops + Validation workshop in Accra
- Objectives:
 - Validate draft C & P Plan for R-pp Development
 - Hold discussions on REDD+ and how it can compliment other activities (& initiatives in Ghana)
 - Identify an overall framework of options for REDD in Ghana

Outcomes of REDD+ Workshops

- C & P Plan not fully validated: participants did not receive information sufficiently in advance.
- Comments were received with regard to:
 - institutions
 - Processes
- Considerable information has been provided on REDD+
- Due to complexity & uncertainties involved, more elaborate process of information sharing and capacity building is needed
- Framework of potential REDD+ activities identified
 - Activities have been subjected to expert assessments
 - Prioritisation will be carried out to...
 - Provide the basis of the R-pp strategy

Other Activities

- Mapping of stakeholders
- Establishment of multi-stakeholder steering committee (NRSC)
- NRSC has held 3 meetings so far
- Antecedents to the NRSC
 - REDD Technical Committee
 - Governing body (Steering Committee)

Next Steps

- Revision of draft R-pp based on comments from Working Groups
- Distribution of revised R-pp to wider stakeholder groups
- Validation Workshop
- Revision of R-pp following workshop
- Submission of R-pp to FCPF

Key questions that have emerged

- Would REDD+ not hamper development?
- How relevant is REDD+ compared with other efforts at addressing Climate Change?
- What activities can be included in REDD+?
- How do we synergise REDD+ with other forestry sector initiatives?
- What is Ghana's position on REDD+?
- How do we ensure that communities benefit?

A critique of the process so far

- General perception of a rushed process
- Working to a pre-determined time table does not allow for adequate consultation & participation
- Tele-guided process; ad hoc meetings that are not adequately prepared for
- Inadequate time for consultation as set out in the agreed principles of C & P
- Centralised consultation schedule no resources for intra-stakeholder group consultation or feedback

Some Challenges

- The lack of clarity on the whole REDD process
- The absence of definite commitments in terms of benefits
- The multi-sectoral nature of REDD+ presents some institutional challenges
- Issues of land tenure and benefit sharing present challenges
- How to fully discuss REDD+ without raising undue expectations amongst stakeholders
- How to achieve synergy between REDD and the other numerous initiatives in Ghana

Concluding Remarks

- Some national initiatives are in place to address issues of REDD+ already
- Need for harmonisation and synergising these with REDD+ process
- Some level of awareness created about REDD+
- Interesting moves to mainstream REDD & Climate Change issues
- But given the uncertainties and complexities, more effective consultation is required
