Background: Challenges

- World Bank's challenges in delivering REDD+ Readiness services (assistance + supervision) to all 37 REDD Country Participants under the current arrangement
- Situations halting or slowing down progress:
 - 1. The Bank has no program in the Country
 - 2. The Bank finances no forest sector operations in the Country
 - 3. The Bank has insufficient staff to support Country's Readiness efforts
 - 4. The Country is not requesting the Bank's assistance for REDD+ Readiness
 - 5. The dialogue between the Country and the Bank in areas relevant for REDD+ Readiness is not conducive for engagement in REDD+
- Things change over time, but FCPF implementation challenge is now
- No organization can provide REDD+ Readiness support by itself
 - REDD+ challenge requires intervention of all actors with experience and expertise in a coordinated fashion

Background: PC Discussions and Resolutions

- PC 4 (Washington, DC, October 2009)
 - The FMT presented the rationale for relying on multiple delivery partners
 - Failed attempt to set up a working group to review options
- PC5 (Gabon, March 2010)
 - PC recognized "the need to include other entities alongside the World Bank as delivery partners"
 - Requested the FMT to review relevant precedents
- PC6 (Guyana, June 2010)
 - FMT presented some analysis on the operational aspects of putting in place multiple delivery partners
 - Presented overview of relevant precedents :
 - Global Environment Facility
 - Climate Investment Funds
 - UN-WB Partnership Framework for Crisis and Post-Crisis Situations
 - Adaptation Fund
 - Set up a Working Group

Working Group (1)

- First meeting in Washington on September 15-16, 2010
 - Self-selection:
 - PC members (REDD countries + financial contributors)
 - Civil society and Indigenous Peoples observers
 - Potential delivery partners
 - Reviewed relevant precedents in detail
 - Discussed modalities of relying on multiple delivery partners

Working Group (2)

- Draft recommendations of the Working Group that are relevant to the proposed Participants Assembly (PA) Resolution:
 - Identified three MDBs and three UN agencies as potential delivery partners alongside the World Bank
 - Recommended that the FMT propose several countries to pilot delivery of services to countries to formulate their R-PPs for approval by PC7, subject to World Bank's internal approvals
 - Recommended that the FMT present "a draft resolution to the PA for consideration and adoption, as opposed to proposing amendment to the Charter, as specified in PC Resolution PC6/2010/6, in order to provide legal basis for carrying out the pilots."

Legal Basis

- Charter
 - The World Bank is the secretariat, the Trustee and the only delivery partner
 - The provisions do not allow the Trustee to transfer funds to other delivery partners
 - There are no provisions on the functions of delivery partners
- Need to provide legal basis for carrying out pilots (if the PC approves the pilots), through
 - Charter amendment

or

- PA Resolution to adopt the terms of piloting multiple delivery partners
- Working Group draft recommendation
 - Due to piloting nature, a PA Resolution with consent of all the FCPF Participants provides sufficient legal basis

Terms of the Piloting Arrangement

- Application of and relationship with the FCPF Charter
 - Applying to the pilots approved by the PC
 - PA Resolution takes precedence over the relevant provisions of the Charter

Delivery Partners

- Delivery Partners carry out activities, including technical support, entering into grant agreement, and supervising grant implementation
- Each Delivery Partner follows its own policies and procedures in managing and supervising the use of the funds transferred to the Delivery Partners under agreement with the FCPF Trustee
- Delivery Partners are accountable to the PC

Trustee of the Readiness Fund

- Transfers funds to the PC in accordance with PC decisions
- Requiring financial reports from the delivery partners as agreed between the Trustee and the Delivery Partners

Adoption of PA Resolution

Sequencing:

- 1. FMT presents the PA Resolution at PA3 (November 1) but does not seek immediate adoption, due to the following reasons:
 - The draft recommendations of the Working Group on Multiple Delivery Partners first have to be discussed at PC7 (November 2-3)
 - The terms applicable to piloting Multiple Delivery Partners will apply only after the PC approves the pilots
 - Not all the Participants are in attendance at PA3
- 2. In the event that the PC approves the pilots, the FMT will circulate the PA Resolution, which shall become subject to:
 - There not being any objection from Participants within 30 days of the PA Resolution circulation date
 - World Bank internal approvals
