
# Mozambique Draft RPP: TAP Comments & Recommendations



## Mozambique: forest poor, but importantance of trees for livelihoods and environment

About 19 million ha of forests (25% forest cover), deforestation rate of about 0.3%, Livelihoods highly dependent on forest resources. 85 % of rural energy is derived from fuelwood and charcoal.





#### Overall Summary: Strengths of the RPP

	The TAP appreciated the we	II formulated and properl	ly presented Draft R-PP:
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- □ Very well composed; addresses most of the key issues requested by the FCPF for four of the six components (Components 1-4, though still need to address all comments made by the TAP in the next version of the R-PP).
- ☐ Institutional involvement and institutional arrangements are well described, problem analysis (institutional, economic, ecological and social) well prepared
- ☐ A comprehensive plan for moving forward with consultations, with target groups and objectives, is presented together with a detailed table of activities, responsibilities, locations, and time frame
- ☐ Useful and comprehensive background sections in all components, particularly in components 1 and 2a.
- ☐ Thorough and comprehensive analysis of the causes of forest cover change
- ☐ Clearly defined and well presented REDD+ Strategy options, clear ideas on where learning and piloting should take place.

#### Areas that need further work

- ☐ The R-PP does not make any reference to the existing draft REDD+ National Strategy and its alignment with the identified drivers (2b).
- Better link identified governance challenges to the proposed REDD+-strategy (2b, 2c)
- Develop clear TORs for reference level (RL) determination and include policy and governance variables in the setting up of scenarios (2b and 3)
- Elaborate on how the MRV will be designed, how it will operate, and how it will deliver what is required for Mozambique to enter REDD+ (4a,b)
- Budget figures needs to be completed and sources of funding indicated (all sections and section 5); section 6 needs to be elaborated
- → Be more explicit on capacity building activities, responsibilities and budgeting in the key areas in the process of R-PP implementation
