### **Country Context: Belize**



Land area: 22,200 Km2

• Population: 338,000

• Economy: agriculture, industry and services

• Forest cover: 14,000 Km2 (63 %)

• Deforestation rate (1980-2013): 0.6% per year



### Strengths of the RPP Document

- The R-PP clearly presents the need to improve forest governance.
- The proposal provides key information on trends in forest cover, land use change and drivers of deforestation and forest degradation.
- The description of the consultation framework including Indigenous Peoples is well articulated.
- The proposed information system on multiple benefits, other impacts, governance, and safeguards is well presented.

#### **Key Issues and Recommendations:**

- The document should provide a work plan for Reference Levels that includes the main drivers of deforestation and forest degradation.
- The R-PP should also describe the relationships between component 4a (MRV) and other components (mostly 2a, 2b).
- The TAP recommends to continue and enhance dialogue, consultation and participation with Indigenous Peoples in relation to the REDD+ process in Belize, particularly in discussing the present version of the R-PP.
