About this document

This template is for use by Readiness Fund (RF) REDD+ Country Participants to report their annual progress on REDD+ readiness activities in general, and on FCPF-supported activities in particular. Report preparation

SECTION A: NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. In brief, what were the main REDD+ readiness-related <u>activities</u> and achievements delivered within your country during the last year?

Advances in REDD + preparation over the past year have allowed Chile to sign an Emission Reduction Payment Agreement (ERPA) with the Carbon Fund, being the first country in Latin America to sign an **ERPA**. Additionally, Chile obtained approval for a Green Climate Fund (**GCF**) Results-Based Payments project. Both projects are part of the National Strategy on Climate Change and Vegetation Resources (ENCCRV, Spanish acronym).

The country has achieved great progress on the REDD+ elements. After the establishment of the ENCCRV and consignation of the FREL/FRL in 2016 by the UNFCCC, during Fiscal Year 20 (FY20), the 1st Technical Annex of REDD+ Results has been consigned and officially published in August 2019. This report was prepared in accordance to the methods used for the Forest Reference Level. Furthermore, as part of the National Forest Monitoring System (NFMS), Chile has made significant progress in the development of technological tools that enable the MRV system to standardize, automatize, monitor and report the impacts of the ENCCRV activities in the country. This progress is mainly related to improvement of (i) information for reporting, (ii) developing procedures for information analysis, (iii) computing tools to automatize the processes, and systems to monitor the social, economics, and environmental impacts of the REDD+ activities. The above mention, includes the development of tools to enable a Safeguards Information System, as an IT tool for monitoring the impacts of ENCCRV activities.

During FY20, the development of the **SIS computer platform** has been finalized, once available and published online, the platform will allow: (i) entering information of the activities carried out within the ENCCRV framework, (ii) monitoring

management of safeguards during the development of the activities, (iii) entering verification data source and, (iv) generating semi-automated reports that will be the basis for preparing reports on compliance with safeguards. Additionally, through this system, Chile will be able to follow-up the requests submitted to the Grievance Mechanism, which in the case of ENCCRV has been established through CONAF's own mechanism "Information, Claims and Suggestions Offices (OIRS)".

Finally, it is important to mention, that progress has been made in strengthening institutional capacities, particularly in the ERPA accounting area regions. Training sessions have been delivered to professionals from the National Forest Corporation (CONAF), other external professionals, and future beneficiaries in different topics for implementation of the ENCCRV, reaching 663 people trained, of which 271 were women.

2. What were the main REDD+ readiness-related challenges and/or problems during the last year?

The main challenges encounter during the preparation of REDD + readiness activities during the last year are those related to raising enough resources to achieve the implementation phase of the ENCCRV. It is important to note, that this situation is different for the Readiness phase, for which Chile has received financial and technical support to satisfactorily complete the preparation phase. Nonetheless, there are not enough resources to date to implement the activities to achieve the goals established in the ENCCRV for the phase of implementation.

For instance, Thanks to the FCPF readiness and other preparation funds, it was possible to complete the REDD+ preparation phase and, therefore, request two payment for results projects, which will be invested in the implementation phase. However, these payments will not be enough to meet the objectives established in the ENCCRV.

It is worth mentioning that for the case of the ENCCRV, conditional financial resources were defined, which, among other things, it sought to develop a new instrument and an amendment to the Native Forest Law, which unfortunately has not happen.

In addition to the above, the political-social crisis that occurred in October 2019 and the current health crisis caused by COVID-19, has exacerbated the situation and it is likely that the government's priorities and economic strengthening will not be focused on the forestry sector, but to the health sector, pensions, education, among others. Consequently, it will be difficult to obtain additional national resources for the implementation of the ENCCRV.

3. What are the main REDD+ readiness-related <u>activities</u> that you hope to deliver, and <u>achievements</u> anticipated during the <u>next year</u>?

It is expected that during FY21 Chile will complete all the requirements of the FCPF Methodological Framework and thereby comply with the conditions of effectiveness established in the ERPA to carry out the first transfer of ER to the Carbon Fund. The pending activities correspond to completing the national forest reference level and finishing the Benefit Sharing Plan and preparing its respective Operations Manual. In addition, the BSP's regional governance bodies must be established.

In addition to completing the entire process of capacity building and having the ENCCRV Information Platform operational, it will contain the NFMS and the SIS.

The general objective of the ENCCRV is achieved by focusing the implementation of REDD+ activities in the country through the implementation areas prioritization system, developed to select or discard areas, considering environmental and social indicators. These indicators include gender and indigenous people, implementation costs, and other topics. This objective is achieved by emphasizing the actions to be carried out in the country's most vulnerable population, associated with small and medium-sized owners of areas with high poverty rates and areas with limited natural resources, which will be the priorities in the implementation of the ENCCRV

Furthermore, to support the monitoring of the impact of the ENCCRV REDD+ activities, eight indicators were developed that address non-carbon benefits. These indicators correspond to 3 environmental

and 5 social indicators. These indicators have a spatially expression in the country through the Cobenefits System.

The first specific objective of the ENCCRV states: "To contribute to the fulfilment of the commitments assumed by Chile, from the field of vegetational resources, before the UNFCCC, UNCCD, CBD and other national and Internationals", so that within the criteria established to implement actions in the territory, it is always considered to improve and strengthen the biodiversity of the native ecosystems.

This will be done through the implementation of action measures, mainly those to be developed in territory, such as sustainable forest management, restoration of ecosystems and afforestation of fragmented areas.

Knowledge management is essential to advance REDD+, so the products and technical guidance that the FCPF delivers to the countries is essential. However, we have found that there are some modifications to the guidelines established in the methodological framework, or guidelines that are being modified following to the signing of assumed commitments, which generates confusion in some cases.

On the other hand, the new FCPF web page delivers valuable and orderly information, with a more modern design, however, there are links with useful information such as https://www.forestcarbonpartnership.org/sites/fcp/files/2016/Dec/FCPF_CFM15_Resolution_1_Chile%20FINAL.pdf that have been removed or place elsewhere. We suggest incorporating them back for the countries to have full accessibility tothem.
